



Learning to Be Content

How content are you? On a scale from 1 to 10, with 1 being “so miserable and dissatisfied with my life that I can’t stop complaining” and 10 being “perfectly satisfied,” how content? Say the number out loud.

What makes you content? Does your life have to be pretty good (financially secure, no health problems, etc.) for you to be content? How much adversity can you handle before your score drops?

What if you could be content no matter what? Wouldn’t that be great—if you could score a 7, 8, 9, or even a 10 despite suffering and adversity? The Apostle Paul wrote, “I have learned in whatever situation I am to be content” (Philippians 4:11 ESV). Was that some kind of superpower only apostles had? Or is it a real possibility for ordinary Christians like us? Hebrews 13:5 says, “Keep your life free from love of money, and be content with what you have, for he has said, ‘I will never leave you nor forsake you.’” It seems God not only offers us contentment but also wants us to have it! But how? How can we become content, despite the disappointments in life, and stay content, despite the disasters?

That’s the subject of a little book I have been reading, *The Rare Jewel of Christian Contentment*, by Jeremiah Burroughs. The title may have tipped you off that it is an old book. In fact,

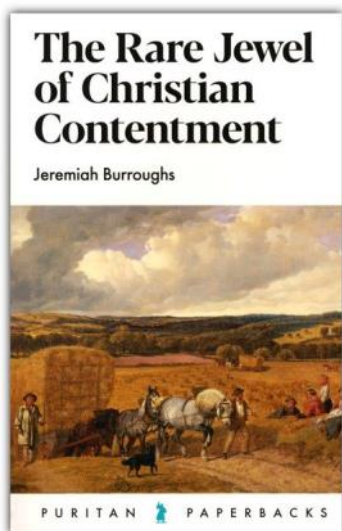
it was first published in 1648, two years after Burroughs died. I like old books. Our ancestors were tougher than we are and less distracted by 24/7 infotainment. Plus, they saw things in a different way, and that helps give me a wider perspective.

Jeremiah Burroughs was a pastor in the 1630s and 40s. He knew suffering firsthand. Those were days of unrest in England. The same political and religious turmoil that drove the pilgrims to America continued to roil England in the following decades. In 1636, the government removed Burroughs as pastor from the church he served because he did not support the way the state church was run. He spent four years teaching in an English-speaking congregation in Holland before political changes in England allowed him to return. He became a pastor in London and was a participant in the Westminster Assembly. (The Assembly produced the Westminster Confession of Faith, one of our church’s *Confessional Standards*.)

As a pastor, he served anxious people. During the 1640s, England was torn by civil war, the king versus Parliament. The war produced fear and uncertainty. Lives, fortunes, and social standing were lost. Meanwhile, the plague was a threat. It hit London in 1636. Plus, life was generally harder in those days. The folks in his congregations had reasons for discontent and anxiety! ... But he knew God wanted better for them.



His book is filled with pearls of wisdom. For example, “The world is infinitely deceived in thinking that contentment lies in having more than we already have.” Most people deceive themselves that way, don’t they? They think, “If I only had that better job ... if I only had a little more money ... if I only had a better romantic relationship, then—then I would be truly happy!” Strangely, those who attain these things find the magic quickly wears off.



Burroughs has a theory about this. He says more stuff will never satisfy you because your heart was not made to be satisfied by stuff. I paraphrase. He wrote, “The reason why you have not got contentment in the things of the world is not because you

have not got enough of them—that is not the reason—but the reason is, because they are not things proportionable to that immortal soul of yours that is capable of God himself. Many men think that when they are troubled and have not got contentment it is because they have but a little in the world, and that if they had more, then they should be content. That is just as if a man were hungry, and to satisfy his craving stomach he should gape and hold open his mouth to take in the wind, and then should think that the reason why he is not satisfied is because he has not got enough of the wind; no, the reason is because the thing is not suitable to a craving stomach.” You will satisfy your hungry stomach by swallowing air before you will satisfy your soul with stuff. Why? Burroughs answers, “A soul that is capable of God can be filled with nothing else but God.”

Psalm 73:25 says, “Whom have I in heaven but you? And there is nothing on earth that I desire besides you.” One secret to contentment is knowing God is all you need. This demands more than thinking it is true. You must know it from experience.

Here lies the difference between religion and Christianity. Religion says, “Stuff will satisfy me, and I will use God to get stuff. I will be good so that God will

bless me.” Christianity says, “God has given me himself. What more do I need?”

Burroughs offers more pearls of wisdom. One I particularly like is, “When some men and women are complaining so much, and always whining, it is a sign that there is an emptiness in their hearts.”

Another gem, “You do not find one godly man who came out of an affliction worse than when he went into it; though for a while he was shaken, yet at last he was better for an affliction. But a great many godly men, you find, have been worse for their prosperity.”

Along with this valuable wheat, there is some chaff. I don’t agree with Burroughs at every point, nor do I find all his advice helpful. Overall, however, I have found the book meaningful as I pursue a deeper contentment.

I wonder if contentment is not something we attain so much as it is God’s gift to us. I suspect that deep, abiding contentment comes from God. His Holy Spirit works this in the hearts of his children. Nevertheless, I think we have a part to play. Contentment begins with knowing and trusting God. It involves the right attitude. Above all, it means surrendering your will to God’s will. Not that when problems arise, we simply resign ourselves to them. Rather, we use every means God gives us to overcome our circumstances. In the end, though, and throughout the struggle, we must be ready to say, “Not my will but yours be done.” Much of the book presses readers to do that.

If you belong to Jesus, God does not necessarily want to make you happy and prosperous in this life. How can you become like Jesus if you never suffer? And yet, God does want you to be joyful and content. How can this be? If you need abundance and a hassle-free existence to be joyful and content, you’ve got a problem. God, however, would teach you to be joyful and content in all circumstances. This is something the world cannot understand, but it is the birthright of every believer.

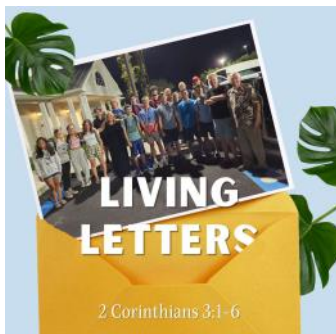

Stephen Ministers are there:

- ... *after* the phone call you hoped you'd never get.
- ... *after* the divorce papers are served and the bottom falls out of your life.
- ... *after* the funeral, when everyone has left and the emotions you've held at bay come crashing in on you.
- ... *after* the doctor says, “I'm sorry, but there's nothing more we can do.”
- ... *after* the nursing home director shakes your hand and says, “Welcome to your new home.”
- ... *after* the last child honks the horn, waves, and drives away—and the house suddenly seems empty.
- ... *after* the gavel goes down, the handcuffs go on, and your loved one is led away.
- ... *after* the baby arrives, demanding more of you than you ever dreamed possible.
- ... *after* you find a pink slip with your final paycheck.
- ... *after* your family and friends have heard your story one too many times, but you still need to talk it out.

Stephen Ministers are the “After People.” They are ready to come alongside you—or your friends, neighbors, coworkers, or relatives—and provide comfort and support for as long *after* as needed.

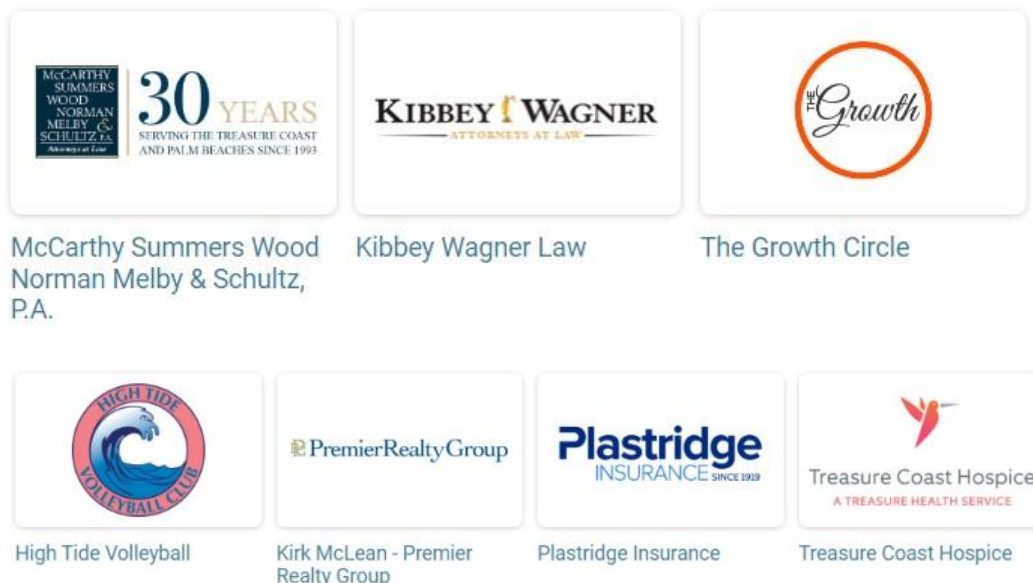
