Welcome Al Rivett, Interim Assistant Pastor

On Tuesday, June 24, Al Rivett began serving as our interim assistant pastor. He will be helping me out, filling in when I am away, working with our vision team and finance committee, and handling some administrative tasks. He will be serving part time, about 20 hours per week. We are happy to welcome him as part of our team while we search for a permanent, full-time second pastor. We have been searching for a while, but these things take time. Thankfully, we are not without help while we continue the search!


Al is a commissioned lay pastor approved by the Presbytery of Florida to serve as pastor of a church. (The technical designation is CLP 2). This means he is an elder who has some seminary training. He also has specialized interim pastor training, and served as transitional pastor of Christ Presbyterian Church in Barnwell, South Carolina, for two years. Al has been active in church leadership since 1996. His home congregation is Indian River Presbyterian, where he has served as an elder. He has been through the visioning process twice, once as an elder and once as a pastor. Al and his wife, Donna, make their home in Fort Pierce.

Al's professional career was mainly in community development and the non-profit world. For example, he was the director of Habitat for Humanity in St. Lucie County. He worked for the St. Lucie County Chamber of Commerce as both executive vice president and director of governmental

relations. He has served on boards and chaired numerous community organizations.



I knew Al from my work with the presbytery. When I approached him about the possibility of helping us, our needs and his gifts seemed to line up well. He is a man of faith and integrity. He has a heart for people and the church. I recently asked Al a few questions about himself and his calling.

Al, what do you want the folks at PCPC to know about you as you begin your ministry here?

I've taken several spiritual assessments, and each shows I'm very high in "faith." I believe and trust in the sovereignty of our Lord, even in the midst of life's challenges. This is particularly true during my current season of life in which I'm dealing with a health issue of a loved one.

Please share with us how you came to faith and why you are a Christian.

I've known Jesus since I was a child. I don't remember a conversion experience, but a major life challenge resulted in a deeper faith. Out of the clear blue, my

former wife declared that she no longer wished to be married. Heartbroken, the experience brought me to my knees, turning the situation completely over to Jesus for Him to handle. Life has never been the same. I was put on the path to wed my wife, Donna, now of more than 23 years, and to serve Jesus in formal ministry as a pastor. Praise God!

What is your favorite part of pastoral ministry?

This is difficult to answer because I enjoy it all. I consider myself to be a "jack of all trades, master of none." Although I do many things well, among my favorites are problem solving and ministry implementation.

Besides the Bible, what is your favorite book?

I am a fan of author C.J. Box and his Joe Pickett series.

Favorite movie?

I've seen the last two seasons of The Chosen in the theater. My favorite non-Christian movie is Independence Day.






Saturday, August 2 9:00 a.m. - 12:00 p.m. Lunch included!

Women's Bible Study


Thursdays, 9:30 a.m.

A Place to Pray

We are told that we can pray anytime and anyplace. Paul wrote to the Thessalonians that they should "pray without ceasing" (1 Thessalonians 5:17 ESV). If we pray continually, we don't necessarily need a specific place to pray. But what did Jesus do? We are told in Mark 1:35, "And rising very early in the morning, while it was still dark, He departed and

went out to a desolate place, and there He prayed." Jesus was very deliberate in His praying.

Jesus sought out a quiet place, not just for Him to speak to the Father, but so that He could "hear" what the Father might say to Him. This is our example.

We pray and ask for help making decisions. We pray and ask for

comfort for those who are suffering in some way. We pray for healing. We pray for our loved ones, and we pray for strangers. We pray for our church, and we pray for our country. In fact, we pray for the entire world!! Often, we have a laundry list of items we present to God in prayer. We want what we want when we want it! Yet, do we listen? Do we set aside that quiet time, in that quiet place where we can "be still, and know that I am God" (Psalm 46:10)?

Before Jesus chose His twelve disciples, He spent the entire night in prayer. Luke 6:12 tells us, "In these days, He went out to the mountain to pray, and all night He continued in prayer to God. And when day

came, He called His disciples and chose from them twelve, whom He named apostles ..." Thus, Jesus spent the entire night in prayer before He chose His apostles. How long do we spend in prayer before a big decision? How much time do we spend communicating with our Father? Remember, communication involves not just speaking but listening too. Before the miracle of Jesus raising Lazarus from the dead, Jesus prayed, saying "Father, I thank you that You have heard Me. I knew that You always hear

Me ..." (John 11: 41-42). And then Lazarus came out of the grave.

The lesson from Jesus is that we pray without ceasing. Do we need a specific place to pray? Not necessarily. However, going to a special place might just give us the comfort we often seek. What is most important is that we find a quiet place in our minds where we lift our minds and hearts up to Him and we

thank Him! We thank Him because we know we can be assured that He hears us and WILL answer us. It is in His time that our prayers are answered. Also, we acknowledge that His time is always perfect. The most important lesson for us is that we take some time to *speak* to Him, and then, most importantly, we take the time to *listen* to Him. It is not the place that is important, but the time. Remember, we must be still to "hear" Him. "For thus saith the Lord God, the Holy One of Israel ... in quietness and in confidence shall be your strength ..." (Isaiah 30:15 KJV).

Let us pray. Amen.

Our Community Table (OCT) is a faith-based ministry that brings churches and the community together to help feed those in need in Martin and Okeechobee counties. Since its start at the height of the pandemic, OCT has grown from serving 124 weekly meals to currently serving over 1,800 meals every Saturday. That's 350,000 meals to date! Volunteers arrive at 7:00 a.m. every Saturday to cook, set up and plate meals, clean up, and transport food. They

distribute free meals, along with Bibles and prayer, to a dozen different locations in our community.

OCT is manned entirely by volunteers, and 100% of all donations go directly to creating meals. Your support strengthens us in both visible and unseen ways. Thank you for standing with us as we seek to reach our community with the love and truth of Jesus Christ.


Please know that we are also praying for you, your pastor, your staff, and your faithful ministry in Palm City.




