## **Questions about Israel, the Bible, and the End Times**

On October 7, the terror attacks against Israel stunned the world. I continue to grieve this tragedy. The subsequent war against Hamas has raised many theological questions within our congregation. People are asking me:

- ◆ "We're seeing news feeds about Israel's war against Hamas all week. On Sunday, we are hearing your sermon series about the Exodus. What is the connection between Israel back then and Israel today? Are they the same? Different? How?"
- ◆ "Are the events in Israel today signs of the end times? If so, what do they mean?"

I hear these questions and variations of them frequently. I thought readers of our newsletter might appreciate answers.

Can we draw a straight line from the Exodus generation who left Egypt under Moses to the modern state of Israel? Yes and no. Yes, in the sense that Israel is a Jewish state, and Jews are physically descended from the Exodus generation. They share a common heritage and traditions, such as Passover. All this is complicated by the fact that some Jews adhere strictly to a literal interpretation of the Old Testament while others are more theologically liberal, and still others do not believe in God at all. Still, there is a connection.

However—and here it gets a little tricky—the Bible speaks about "the Israel of God" (Galatians 6:16). The Israel of God is heir to the covenant promises given to Abraham. God works out his purposes for salvation through the Israel of God. Who is

the Israel of God? Jesus is the Israel of God!

Continued from page 1 All the promises of God find their fulfillment in Jesus. Everything in the Old Testament both prepared for and pointed to Jesus. Importantly, Jesus saw himself as the true Israel, the Israel of God. This is why he chose twelve disciples. In the Old Testament, Jacob (a.k.a. Israel) had twelve sons, and they became the twelve tribes of Israel. By appointing twelve special disciples, Jesus made the implicit claim to be the true Israel. He was reconstituting Israel around himself. Also, John 15:1 records that Jesus said, "I am the true vine." Jews in that day immediately recognized the reference. Isaiah 5:1-7, Jeremiah 6:9, and Hosea 10:1 refer to Israel as a vine. "I am the true vine" means "I am the true Israel." I could point to many other ways that Jesus claimed to be the Israel of God.

The Israel of God also includes all those who, by faith, are united to Jesus. Paul gives us a beautiful picture in Romans 11 that helps us understand this. He compares Israel to an olive tree. (In keeping with Jesus' claim to be the true Israel, the tree is also Jesus.) Jews who believe in Jesus are natural branches that belong to the tree. Jews who do not believe in Jesus are natural branches that have been cut off by unbelief. Gentiles who believe in Jesus are branches from wild olive trees that have been grafted into the tree. It is not that the church replaces Israel in God's plan. Rather, Israel always was the church, and the church is the Israel of God. God's plan all along was for a people from every race and nation, redeemed by Jesus and united with him.

Where does that leave Jews? Has God's plan simply moved on without them? No, for two reasons. First, in every generation, many Jews come to faith in Jesus. God never stops calling them! As Paul says in Romans 3, being a Jew is a big advantage because the scriptures that point to Jesus belong to them. Second, as Paul says in Romans 11:28-29, "They are beloved for the sake of their forefathers. For the gifts and the calling of God are irrevocable." Jews remain special to God. This does not mean one can be saved by being a good Jew apart from faith in Jesus. Jesus insists that he is the one way for both Jews and Gentiles. Paul explains this in the early chapters of Romans. Both Jews and Gentiles need the Savior, because "all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God" (Romans 3:23). Nor does this mean that the modern state of Israel plays a central role in God's end-times plans.

Christians notoriously disagree about the details of the end times. All agree that someday Jesus will return to judge the world. Beyond this, a handful of differing views compete in the marketplace of biblical interpretation. Our Essential Tenets do not require any particular view. ECO has no official or required position. Within our church, there are several different perspectives, and our rule should be charity toward one another. We are all trying to honor God's Word and read it correctly. We may disagree, but these disagreements are not on essential matters. That is important to remember.

I am an amillennialist. That is, I believe the thousandyear reign of Christ mentioned in Revelation 20:6 is symbolic, not literal. It represents the time from Jesus' ascension until his return. During this time, Jesus rules. Nevertheless, during this time, his church experiences tribulation. Both can be true at the same time. Both are.

I believe that someday Jesus will return, and that will be GAME OVER. The archangel blasts the mighty trumpet of God, and that is like the referee's final whistle signaling, "Time's up!" At that point, the dead in Christ will be raised. Those believers still alive will be glorified. God will judge the living and the dead. And, Jesus will make all things new.

#### RECAP OF OCTOBER






### Palm City's Got Talent!


### Sanctuary Service

### **GriefShare Program**

GriefShare, facilitated by Florine Blackshear, offers biblical, Christ-centered teaching that focuses on topics associated with the death of a loved one. The DVD seminar features nationally respected grief experts and real-life stories of people, followed by discussion. Many grieving people find they are only beginning the work of healing when friends or family have returned to their daily life routines. Too often, people tend to stuff their grief instead of allowing it to do the God-given work for which it is intended. Don't allow fear of what others may think to keep you from what could help you. Confidentiality is a key part of this program.

Whether your bereavement experience is recent or not, you will find encouragement, comfort, and help in grieving the death of a loved one. This is an opportunity to be around people who understand what you are feeling. You will learn how to recognize the symptoms of being stuck in grief and that you do not need to live in bondage to certain emotions. You will learn valuable information about facing your new normal in life and renewing your hope for the future. Are the events in Israel right now signs of the end times? Yes, in a general way. Jesus said, "When you hear of wars and rumors of wars, do not be alarmed. This must take

place, but the end is not yet. For nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. There will be earthquakes in various places; there will be famines. These are but the beginning of the birth pains" (Mark 13:7-8). However, I would not try to find this war in the Bible or interpret it as the specific fulfillment of any prophecy.

Notice Jesus said, "Do not be alarmed." God gave us the book of the Revelation to comfort us, not to terrify us! The point is God wins. Christians should live with confidence, knowing that whatever happens in history, God is working out his plan and purposes. Do not fear. Persevere. That is the message. Because we do not know when Jesus will return, we must be ready at any time. How? We are ready for his return when we are busy doing the things he has called us to do.
