Welcome New Staff

In August, PCPC welcomed two new staff members. Richie Kim is our full-time youth leader. Charity Maehl is part-time as administrative assistant.

Richie Kim leads our youth ministry under the supervision of Assistant Pastor Jason Pridmore. Richie is not new to PCPC. In the fall semester of 2021, he served an internship here, working with our youth. He is a ministry student at Southeastern University. In August 2021, Pastor Jason brought him on as a youth helper. In the spring of this year, he led the Middle School Youth Group. As Pastor Jason transitions from day-to-day, hands-on youth ministry to more pastoral functions, Richie is taking up those responsibilities. In addition to our youth group meetings and special events, Richie is involved with Young Life and First Priority.



Richie brings extensive experience. In early 2017, he was a missionary in Lebanon through Youth with a Mission (YWAM). His work in youth ministry began later in 2017 at St. Andrew Lutheran in Port St. Lucie, where he was a youth assistant. From August 2018 to January 2021, he worked with youth and young adults at Westside Church in Ft. Pierce,

rising to become their interim youth director. His new role at PCPC is a positive and natural development of his ministry.

Most recently, she was the foundation event coordinator for Treasure Coast Hospice. She, too, is a committed follower of Jesus Christ. A Call for Shepherds and Prayer Warriors

All believers have been called to bring glory to God in whatever they do. PCPC is looking for individuals or couples to serve in two important areas.

For our shepherds program, we need a coordinator to oversee 35 flocks, as well as more shepherds to make people in our congregation feel loved and acknowledged. As a shepherd, you would do the following:

- send birthday cards
- send get-well cards
- send anniversary cards
- send "praying for you" cards
- call members of your flock if so desired

If a member of your flock is sick, going to have surgery, or has a difficult situation, and the church has been notified, the coordinator will call or send you an email. You can then send the appropriate type of card. The church provides the cards for this ministry. You are not required to make home visits or phone calls unless you want to. This is a ministry you can do from home.

Our prayer warriors are a group of volunteers committed to interceding on behalf of those who have submitted prayer requests and praises at church. Each volunteer agrees to meet in the PCPC chapel one day a week and pray over the cards that were submitted on the previous Sunday. The amount of time spent praying is up to each prayer warrior.

Three pastors (Pastor Jeefrey Arrogonte, Baybay City; Pastor Tito Nelson, Tacloban; Pastor Bene Cabase, Bohol) joined their Evangel Family Churches for a joint youth camp in Baybay City. 104 youths came together from different parts of Leyte and Bohol islands to the university venue in Baybay City for three days of evangelism, fellowship, and learning. TACLOBAN

Throughout the summer, Giegie and Pastor Edgar Tacata conducted "Teaching Children Effectively" training classes for teachers and leaders in churches throughout Leyte, including Tabontabon, Baybay City, Tacloban, and Ormoc. These classes are vital in creating effective teachers in the churches. In the classes in Ormoc, there were 26 participants from seven churches coming together to be trained to teach children effectively. Funds from PCPC supported the creation of a Sunday school space separate from the worship area, expanded the main church area, added tiles to the restroom, and repaired the roof for Casa Pastoral. Funding will also allow three vacation Bible schools to be held in three nearby barangays.

Recent PCPC support also helped 37 youths travel to Samar for a regional five-day camp where 500 young people gathered to learn about Jesus.

Entrust by Rob and Sandy Shaffer



This year was the 40th anniversary of our arrival in Austria. That February, we left Bristol, TN, and flew to Europe as a young couple

with a 5-month-old baby. We went to language school, then began working with Biblical Education by Extension (now Entrust). In our early years, Rob traveled frequently to Hungary, Romania, and Czechoslovakia. Sandy taught Sunday school in Vienna and worked as a writer and editor for our mission. When our three girls were old enough, Sandy began traveling as well. It's hard to believe 40 years have gone by since we came to Europe.

Thinking about the number 40 reminded us of its significance in the Bible: During the great flood of

Noah's time, it rained for 40 days and nights. Moses spent 40 years in the desert fleeing from Egypt. He also spent 40 days and nights on Mount Sinai in communion with God. Goliath taunted Saul's army for 40 days before David arrived to slay him. When Elijah fled from Jezebel, he traveled 40 days and nights to Mt. Horeb (Sinai) to be with God. Jesus was tested by Satan for 40 days in the wilderness of Judea. The period from the resurrection of Jesus to His ascension was 40 days. Because they failed to trust God, the Hebrew people wandered in the wilderness for 40 years before entering the promised land. The number 40 seems to appear often in the Bible in contexts dealing with times of hardship or testing of faith. In these contexts, encounters with God took place, and lessons of faith were learned. During the 40 years of wilderness wanderings of the Hebrew people, they learned many important truths about God: they learned that God would provide for their needs (Ex. 16); they learned that He would be their protector and they should not look to other allies or idols for help; they learned to trust God for direction (Ex. 14); they learned that God had good plans for them; they learned that God would discipline them like a loving Father; they learned that God allowed them to be tested so that their faith would grow stronger, they would learn perseverance, and be more fruitful.

As we look back on these 40 years, we can see that God wanted to teach us those same lessons. He tested us as to whether we would trust Him, obey Him, seek to do things His way or our own way, walk away in tough times, or stick to our commitments. Like the Israelites, we failed miserably a lot of times, but He was always there to pick us up. These 40 years showed us a lot about Him—His faithfulness, His patience, His goodness, His mercy, His amazing love. Surely goodness and mercy have followed us all the days of our lives. Not only that, we get to dwell in the house of the Lord and enjoy His presence forever.

Our story isn't over yet, but it's been good to reflect on these 40 years. We thank God for your friendship and faithfulness in prayer and giving throughout the years, which have blessed and encouraged us to run the race until the end.

United Servants Abroad by Tom and Rita Hough, Missionaries




The summer brought two short-term mission teams from Mission Church in Memphis, TN. They partnered with the ministry in Pucallpa for many years. The first team held DVS programs with

the Colegio Misionera and the Refuge of Hope schools. The team also held a short Marriage Encounter Seminar while others of the group did maintenance with water filter installations in Pucallpa. Pastor Will Franco and family came with the second team to share a five-night discipleship seminar with a large group of church believers. The ladies in the group held Bible studies with the "Obra Femenina" women's ministry of the AIESHC Church Association. They also supplied each of the 60 ladies with a family water filtration system (pictured below).



Roberto Torres, the new president of the AIESHC Church Association, is busy organizing and working with church leadership. A third session of 2023 with the Timothy Discipleship Initiative program in Pucallpa finished with 32 church leaders. Another session is scheduled in November. There are plans to begin new classes in Pucallpa next year for those who have completed the CCB village program.

Observing the ongoing ministries with growing relationships brings to mind the verses from Ephesians 2:19-22 about how Jesus established His church for eternity. His church continues to be built; God's church goes on forever!


Currently, our students are working through the book of Mark and exploring the journey of faith: where it begins, where we are on the path, and where we want to go. Under my leadership,




