## February 23 & 24 – USA to the Holy Land

Your pilgrimage begins as you depart the USA on an overnight flight. Our representative will welcome you at the Tel Aviv airport and transfer you to your hotel, where you will enjoy dinner before retiring for the night. (D)

## February 25 – The Galilee

Worship as you sail across the Sea of Galilee. Visit Capernaum, the center of Jesus' ministry in Galilee, and visit the synagogue built on the site where Jesus taught (Matthew 4:13, 23). On the Mount of Beatitudes, contemplate the text of the "Sermon on the Mount" (Matthew 5-7). Explore the Church of the Loaves and Fish at Tabgha, the traditional site of the feeding of the 5,000 (Luke 9:10-17). See the Chapel of the Primacy, where Peter professed his devotion three times to the risen Christ (John 21). In Magdala, once home to Mary Magdalene, visit a recently discovered first-century synagogue. Recall Jesus' baptism by John the Baptist at the Jordan River. (B, D)

## February 26 – Cana, Nazareth, Tel Megiddo & Caesarea

Visit the Franciscan Wedding Chapel in Cana, the site of Jesus' first miracle, before continuing to Nazareth, Jesus' boyhood home (Matthew 2:23). Look out over Tel Megiddo (Armageddon) to view one of the most important archaeological sites in Israel. Today's last stop is Caesarea, a center of the early Christians where an angel visited Cornelius, the first Gentile believer (Acts 10), and where Paul was imprisoned for two years before appealing to Caesar. (B, D)

## February 27 – Beit She'an, Jericho, & Qumran

Start the day in Beit She'an, a city continuously inhabited for over 5,000 years. The uncovered ruins date back to the Greek/Roman city that was part of the Decapolis of Jesus' day. See colonnaded streets with marble sidewalks, Roman public baths, and a theater. As you stop in Jericho to view the ruins of the city conquered by Joshua (Joshua 6:1, 2, 20), in the distance, you can also see the traditional site of the Temptation of Jesus (Matthew 4:1-11). Continue to Qumran, where the Dead Sea Scrolls were discovered in 1947. (B, D)

## February 28 – Bethlehem & Jerusalem

In Bethlehem, visit the cave revered as Jesus' birthplace and see the Church of the Nativity constructed over the site (Matthew 1:18-25). Gaze out over Shepherds' Field before returning to Jerusalem. Explore the poignant exhibits of Yad Vashem, Israel's Holocaust Memorial. (B, D)

## March 1 – Jerusalem & the Old City / Hezekiah's Tunnel

Begin your day with a group picture taken from the Mount of Olives, where Jesus ascended into heaven (Acts 1:9-12). Walk the Palm Sunday Road, pray in the Garden of Gethsemane, and envision the scenes of the night before Jesus' crucifixion (Matthew 26:36-44). Continue to Mount Zion to visit the House of the High Priest Caiaphas, where Jesus was questioned on the night of His betrayal (Matthew 26:57). Meditate on the events of the Last Supper as you visit the traditional location of the Upper Room (Mark 14:12-26). After lunch, wander through the excavations of the City of David. Explore Hezekiah's Tunnel, an amazing engineering feat that was dug from both ends and

met in the middle. Note: Those who are claustrophobic may want to meet the group at the other end of the tunnel. Visit the Pool of Siloam, recently uncovered at the foot of the city. (B, D)

## March 2 – Leisure Day

Today, you have free time to explore on your own, or you may choose to visit Masada and the Dead Sea (additional charge). Ascend by cable car to Masada, Herod's legendary mountaintop fortress that became the last desperate stronghold of the Jewish Zealots against the Romans. You can still look down on the remains of the Roman camps and the siege ramp below. End your day with a dip in the salt and mineral-laden waters of the Dead Sea. (B, D)

**Masada/Dead Sea Option ** (Please note: The Masada/Dead Sea option is more physically intense.)

## March 3 – Jerusalem

Explore ancient Jerusalem at the Teaching Steps and the Western Wall. View the Pool of Bethesda where Jesus performed the Sabbath miracle (John 5:1-18). Sing a hymn in the Church of St. Anne and experience its rich acoustics. Visit Herod's Antonia Fortress, where Jesus appeared before Pontius Pilate (Luke 23:1), and follow in Christ's steps on the Via Dolorosa ("the Way of the Cross"). At the Church of the Holy Sepulchre, take time to reflect on His sacrificial love. Visit the Garden Tomb for a time of reflection and communion. (B, D)

## Wonders of Petra & The Dead Sea

March 4 - 8, 2027 · \$1,348\*

### March 4 – Jerash

This morning, you will journey across the Allenby Bridge on your way to Jerash, one of the best-preserved Roman cities in the world. Stroll through the oval piazza and wander along colonnaded streets etched by the wheels of ancient chariots. Stand in the grand theater where an onstage whisper can be heard in the top row. Continue to your hotel for dinner and overnight.

### March 5 – Petra

Begin your journey south towards Petra today. Explore the city of Petra. Its entrance passes through a long, narrow gorge known as the Siq and can only be accessed by carriage, horseback, or on foot. Once inside the city, marvel at the intricate detail of a city that was cut into the cliffsides of rose-colored rock. Travel to your hotel at the Dead Sea for dinner and overnight.

### March 6 – Madaba & Mount Nebo

Travel to Madaba, the City of Mosaics, to visit the Church of Saint George with its sixth-century Byzantine mosaic map showing Jerusalem and other holy sites. Continue to Mount Nebo, where Moses caught a glimpse of the Promised Land (Deut. 34). On a clear day, you can see all the way across the Jordan Valley and the Dead Sea to the rooftops of Jerusalem and Bethlehem. Return to your hotel for dinner and overnight.

### March 7 – Free Morning at the Dead Sea

Enjoy a free morning at your hotel. Cross the border back into Israel and enjoy dinner in Jerusalem. Afterward, you will travel to the airport in Tel Aviv to begin your journey home.

## Cairo & The Route of The Exodus

March 4 - 9, 2027 · \$1,598\*

### March 4 – Jerusalem to Mount Sinai

Travel in the footsteps of the Holy Family as you travel along the ancient caravan route from Jerusalem to the Sinai Desert. Cross the border and check into your hotel near Mount Sinai for dinner and rest.

### March 5 – St. Catherine's Monastery

Experience a visit to fortified St. Catherine's Monastery, built in the 6th century, and one of the oldest working monasteries in the world, with the world's oldest continually operating library. Both the Codex Sinaiticus and the Syriac Sinaiticus, important early Biblical manuscripts, were discovered here. Even Muhammad found refuge here, and the site is sacred to all three monotheistic religions. Remember the story of Moses and the burning bush, which tradition places inside the monastery. Continue to Sharm el Sheikh for dinner and overnight at your hotel located on the shores of the Red Sea. *Optional Mount Sinai Climb* 

### March 6 – Route of the Exodus

Trace the route of the Exodus along the eastern Sinai coast. Continue to Cairo for dinner and your overnight stay.

### March 7 – Memphis, Saqqara, the Great Pyramids & the Sphinx

Tour the rural region of traditional Egyptian farming. Travel, as Abraham did, to Memphis (Biblical Noph) and on to Saqqara, where you will see the Step Pyramid, the world's oldest stone structure. See the Great Pyramids of Giza and the Sphinx.

### March 8 – Cairo

This morning, visit the Grand Egyptian Museum, which holds 7,000 years of Egyptian history and includes the world-famous golden treasures from King Tutankhamun's tomb. Tour the Old City and see the Citadel of Saladin, built in 1183 AD, and view the Alabaster Mosque of Muhammad Ali. In Old Cairo, visit the Abu Serga Church built over the traditional site of the house where the Holy Family lived during their stay in Egypt. Prepare for your return flight home.

### March 4 – Jerusalem to Mount Sinai

### March 5 – St. Catherine's Monastery

This morning, you can opt to climb Mount Sinai, where tradition says that Moses received the Ten Commandments. Everyone will visit St. Catherine's Monastery. Stay in Sharm el Sheikh, where you will dine at your hotel. *Optional Mount Sinai Climb*

### March 7 – Cairo

### March 8 – Luxor & Karnak

This morning, fly from Cairo to Luxor, ancient Thebes. Visit the magnificent Temple of Luxor, then continue to the Karnak Temple. See the famed Hypostyle Hall, the Obelisks of Queen Hatshepsut and Thutmose III, the Temple of Amun, the Granite Scarab, and the Sacred Lake. Board your Nile cruise ship and enjoy dinner.

### March 9 – Valley of the Kings & Queens & Esna

Visit the Valley of the Kings and then see the Colossi of Memnon, which represent King Amenhotep III. See the Temple of Queen Hatshepsut and then sail to Esna. Your dinner and overnight stay will be on board.

### March 10 – Edfu & Kom Ombo

Visit the Edfu Temple on the west bank of the Nile. Sail to Kom Ombo to visit the Kom Ombo Temple. Enjoy dinner and your overnight stay on board.

### March 11 – Aswan

Set sail on a smaller boat across the Nile to visit the temples at Philae, including the Temple of Isis. Next, visit the High Dam. It was constructed to replace the old Aswan Dam, built in 1902. View the Unfinished Obelisk.

### March 12 – Cairo

Disembark your cruise this morning and fly to Cairo. Enjoy a relaxing afternoon in your hotel, where you will have dinner and spend the night. Prepare for your return flight home.

### March 13 – Return to the USA
