When the bell sounds, please stand as you are able and face the procession.


#### **ADVENT DIALOGUE**

The Spirit and the church cry out: Come, Lord Jesus! All those who await his appearance pray: Come, Lord Jesus!

The whole creation pleads: Come, Lord Jesus! May it be so.

PROCESSION Kyrie Eleison

"Kyrie eleison" means "Lord, have mercy" and is part of the traditional liturgy of the church. The assembly sings the Kyrie refrain. The cantor sings each petition, and the refrain is repeated.



## **WORD**

FIRST READING Isaiah 35:1-10

The prophet describes the return from the Babylonian captivity as a joyous procession to Zion. God's coming reign will bring a renewal of creation in which health and wholeness will be restored. There is no need for fear, for God is coming to save.

- <sup>1</sup> The wilderness and the dry land shall be glad; the desert shall rejoice and blossom; like the crocus <sup>2</sup> it shall blossom abundantly and rejoice with joy and shouting.

  The glory of Lebanon shall be given to it, the majesty of Carmel and Sharon.

  They shall see the glory of the LORD, the majesty of our God.
- 3 Strengthen the weak hands and make firm the feeble knees.

For waters shall break forth in the wilderness and streams in the desert;


- 7 the burning sand shall become a pool and the thirsty ground springs of water; the haunt of jackals shall become a swamp; the grass shall become reeds and rushes.







## GOSPEL MESSAGE

## **KEEPING WATCH**

There's nothing quite like the first smell of springtime flowers emerging from the earth. The sensory explosion often catches us by surprise, reminding us that new life is surely coming soon, even though the world still seems to be slumbering and the buds we watch impatiently refuse to open. This third Sunday of Advent lifts the church and stirs our senses as we receive word, along with John the Baptizer, that Jesus is indeed the one we've been waiting for, the one who will turn buds into blooms. This is good news!

We might wonder, however, why we are hearing this news from John's perspective, out of all the voices in the growing community of Jesus-followers. Can we trust his word? After all, John is sitting behind bars at this time, caught in the gears of the world's injustice. John's unjust imprisonment reminds us that working for justice in the world can cause conflict with those in power. But while the world imprisons the innocent and strains to protect the corrupt and cruel, God sees such injustices and works to undo their power. This, too, is good news!

This third Sunday of Advent is sometimes called Gaudete, meaning "Rejoice." Cultivating joy amid the brokenness seen in the world is difficult, but God brings new beginnings where we have known only endings. New tendrils of life are emerging! Something new is coming! Let's share the good news as we wait and keep watch together.

## **COMMEMORATIONS**

## John of the Cross, renewer of the church, died 1591

#### Sunday, December 14, 2025

John was a member of the Carmelite monastic order, and worked to reform it. His writings reflect a deep interest in mystical thought and meditation.

#### Las Posadas

#### Tuesday, December 16, 2025

This celebration, long popular in Mexico, takes its name from the "posadas," or lodgings, sought by Mary and Joseph in Bethlehem. Their search is reenacted in a neighborhood, unsuccessfully, until finally they are welcomed in, and a party commences.

## Katharina von Bora Luther, renewer of the church, died 1552 Saturday, December 20, 2025

Born to an impoverished nobleman, Katie eventually took vows as a nun, but around age twenty-four she and several other nuns who were influenced by the writings of Martin Luther left the convent. Six children were born to Katie and Martin.
