

From Pastor Jim McClain

As I write this newsletter, I am sitting at a small desk, in a room about the size of a monk's cell, with two twin beds. I am sharing the room with a friend of mine who also enjoys staying at the monastery and volunteered to help me move a load of our stuff out of one garage into our next garage. And, yes, Kercida asked, "And you moved that?" talking about one of the many items I had loaded on the trailer. I simply told her I needed it to hold other pieces in place.

My friend came to help me move. He is the person who introduced me to the monastery, but this time he came to help me move. I had some people I needed to meet with and some issues to be resolved while here, but he came to help me move. Sometimes we need help, we need to allow others to help, and as a community, we need to help each other. The readings for this coming Sunday gave us three images of



helping, from three distinct perspectives: the one being shepherded, the one doing the shepherding, and a community that shepherds.

Most of us are familiar with the 23rd psalm and the experience of the author who is cared for by the spirit of God, led to still waters, and comforted as he walks through the valley of the shadow of death.

The Gospel passage from John 10 describes what it is like to be the one doing the shepherding. In this reading, Jesus is calling forth his sheep with his voice and giving life abundantly. The shepherd is generous, and as we know in this Easter season, he is sacrificial.

The short reading from Acts has its own understanding. It is interesting to consider that one of the outcomes of the resurrection of Christ is a community that shepherds. It is no longer only a one-on-one relationship where one person cares for another person in a transactional way/ An event where one receives what another provides. Most of us have had a spiritual mentor, caregiver or pastor who impacted our lives in this way.

The reading from Acts reminds us that often it isn't just any one person but a place where we felt we could be authentic and more accepted than we had ever felt before. A community and a place where we could come to the table and be at the table. A place that helps us grow and guides us to a good path, personally, professionally, and spiritually, while loving who we are.

As I continue to move towards retirement, I find I need all three. I need to shepherd and care for others. I need one-on-one help to accomplish tasks and reach goals. I need to be part of a loving community that cares and supports others they already know and love and the unknown they may never know. I need a place that allows space for a person to grow and learn about themselves while being accepted for who they are. This communal shepherding involves generosity, a culture of hospitality, the gathering around worship, and rejoicing in being a diverse community together.

Thank you for being all three of those things to me over the last five years. I hope I have been a small part of each expression of what it means to shepherd and to be shepherded for you as well. Keep up the good work and I pray that each of you continue to be that accepting place.



After a short break we will begin children and youth choir on May 7th. We will bring out some recorders, play some more bells and sing some more songs! Please bring your child to join in the fun!



NEIGHBORS HELPING NEIGHBORS MINISTRY

We are continuing to see a steady flow of clients/neighbors in the Pantry weekly and the San Antonio Food Bank (SAFB) truck. Weather conditions were less than desirable for the April 6 food distribution but with modifications to our distribution line, we served about 65 families. That is about half what we typically serve on days of the "truck" distribution. Volunteers were brave and turned out dressed in raingear and smiles. We moved to the portico area so we kept somewhat dry and those neighbors in attendance were able to receive whole chickens, along with fruits and vegetables to name a few of the items. THANK YOU everyone for your service.

Our representative from the SAFB, Kelly, trained a few volunteers on registering clients via our mobile phones. We are going DIGITAL, y'all!!!! We will always have our "hard copy" registration but as we learn this new process we are finding it is quick but also challenging. We go car to car and check each household in and add any information needed that we hadn't already captured or changes that have been made. It does make for a quick report to the Food Bank since it automatically populates and sends all info. It is one of the many changes we have seen as we follow the recommendations as a partner agency.

We see the many ways we can answer the question, "Why are we here?" Come join us and see how you can help be the bridge between the community and the church.
