The Advent of God's Mission

The Season of Advent is the beginning of the liturgical Church year. We hear the prophecies of the coming of Christ. Advent is the Latin word for "coming." The readings in Advent do not only prophesy the birth of Christ, but also the second coming of Christ. So, the Church year begins with prophecies before Christ was born (Advent), then the birth of Christ (Christmas), the revealing of Who Christ is (Epiphany), the sacrifice of Christ (Lent & Holy Week), the Resurrection of Christ (Easter),



and then the acts of the Holy Spirit (Day of Pentecost and the season after Pentecost, where the Holy Spirit is still working through us to reconcile the world back to God).

Each week of Advent will have a theme at Christus Victor. The first week will focus on the hope that Christ gives us. The second week will focus on the peace that Christ brings into the world. The third week is filled with joy because Christ is almost here! The fourth week (which will run from the 4th Sunday of Advent on Dec 23 until the 12th Day of Christmas on January 5) is a long celebration of Who Christ is: love.

When I think about these words, hope, peace, joy, and love, it names my feelings about the new mission statement we have started discerning. I am filled with hope that God will do great things through us, when our wills are aligned with God's mission. I have peace knowing that much of our busy work will be replaced with work that will bear fruit. This reminds me of Luther's word in the small catechism, "you are to go to your work joyfully." And, of course, God's Mission is a mission of love, for God is love. All Christians are commanded to love God and love neighbor; each person and each congregation just lives it out differently.

This Advent Season, do not passively wait for Christ to come. Actively wait, like a waiter waiting on tables. Pray for the advent of the mission that God has for Christus Victor Lutheran Church. The Planting Hope team is filled with energy and excitement about what God is doing here. We know God is calling us to include the entire congregation in developing our mission. After the first meeting on November 10th, through prayer and Bible Study, we heard many action words & phrases like "get up and go," "do," "love without questions," "reach out to non-residents," etc. When we meet next on January 12th, we will continue praying, studying Scripture together, and discussing what God is calling us to do. And, with God's help, we'll start to see some light shed on key phrases that will articulate God's mission for CVLC. Cue the Blues Brothers music, because "we are on a mission from God!" Pray this Advent for the advent of God's mission for us.

Advent Blessings to each of you. Christ warms you with His love.

Another Holy Spirit Moment for the Planting Hope Team

Last night, Tuesday, November 28th, the Planting Hope leadership team met to plan the next congregation-wide event. The energy and excitement among the leaders was great. We were ready to rock and roll. One person proclaimed, "Since the Holy Spirit is leading us, we can't screw this up!"

Right at the end of the meeting, one member looked at the agenda we planned and said "If I were a member, I might get angry if I am asked to be here for the Living Nativity one Saturday, then this agenda the next Saturday, and then Iron Chef and Family night, on Sunday, the next day - all in the middle of December." Suddenly the air was out of the room - and it probably wasn't because of a sugar crash after the cheesecake we ate at the beginning of the meeting. The wind was out of our sails.

Part of our team mission statement is "to include all neighbors." It's important - no, it's imperative! - to us that we have as many people as possible be part of God's mission. Since the Holy Spirit is often associated with wind (John 3:8), when the wind left our sails, we felt the Holy Spirit was telling us not to do the work we were so energized to do. It is like how the Spirit of Jesus prevented Paul from preaching in Asia (Acts 16:6-7). Because Paul did not spend time in Asia, he went to Philippi where two powerful things happened. First, he met, baptized, and discipled Lydia, who was from the very region Paul was prevented from going. Second, he founded the church in Philippi, which Paul loved in abundance unmatched by his love for the other churches (Philippians 1:3-11). We trust God is doing something similar with us right now. And it will be powerful!

So, we have cancelled the December 15th meeting, but we are ready to plant some hope on Saturday, January 12th!

The Holy Spirit is guiding this Planting Hope process. God has a mission for us. We can't screw it up. You are part of what God is doing here! Come, be part of the process to discern, understand, and articulate what God is calling us to do!

Jeff Scott honored for CROP Walk Support

On Thursday, November 29th, the CROP Walk held its 2018 Awards Banquet at St. Paul's Lutheran Church. Jeff Scott was among those honored for raising over \$1,000 as an individual. "I am passionate about walking and exercise," Jeff Scott said, "and here I get to do something good with that passion." Jeff Scott attended the ceremony for the first time in 2017, and thinks he has raised over \$1,000 several years in a row. This year, the CROP Walk raised \$158,800 and distributed 75% of it to international aid and 25% remained local. Some of the local organizations included Meals on Wheels, Housing for New Hope, Open Table Ministry, and Urban Ministries of Durham.

Led by Daniel Hada Harianja, Christus Victor Lutheran Church was recognized for raising more money than they did last year. However, Peace Covenant Church of the Brethen leap frogged CVLC to claim the "small congregation" Silver Sneaker Award. Rev. Ben Krey, the Pastor of CVLC, said, "It is fantastic that everyone is raising more money!" Truly, it's better to come in 3rd but raise more money and help more people as a larger community. The "small congregation" Gold Sneaker once again went to Pilgrim United Church of Christ, which has raised more money than any-sized congregation for many years in a row.

Mayor Steve Schewel was the keynote speaker. He acknowledged the great work of the people who feed the hungry in Durham and also emphasized the great work being done to "shorten the lines." He shared that 50,000 of the 300,000 residents of Durham are food insecure, and "people with a good paycheck are not food insecure." He discussed plans to improve transportation (including light rail, busses, and access to cars), affordable housing, "mid-level" education (like vocational schooling after high school), and services that will "shorten the lines" and make the work of those who feed the hungry even more effective for the individuals they serve. Immediately following the speech, he left the awards ceremony to attend the Durham CAN Metro Council meeting.

The emcee for the evening was Bill Reh, the weather man on WNCN, who has supported the CROP walk as the emcee for "more years than Ican remember."

Christian Education Topics Early 2019

January - Faith & Science

At Bishop's convocation in October, I heard the founder of the STEAM Project (Science & Theology for Emerging Adult Ministries) discuss how important it is that churches talk about science and how rarely churches do talk about science. 52% of the youth in a congregation will go into a science or technology field, yet a church's youth group might talk about science or technology once/year. How will these young people come to know that God is active in their vocation if their church never talks about science?

His website, www.thesteamproject.org, shares a staggering statistic: 70% of 18-23 year olds agree or strongly agree that religion and science conflict. 85% of scientists view science and religion as only sometimes or never in conflict. How does an 18-23 year old know more than a professional scientist about conflicts in faith and science? They don't. It's just that the churches don't talk about science. So, too many of our young people only hear is that evolution is real, and the church only preaches creationism.

There are some great videos on that website. Here's a leading astronomer at NASA talking about where she sees God when she studies galaxies light years away: https://youtu.be/IJckNYqRa5I

St. Augustine wrote that when a non-Christian who knows a field of study well sees a Christian talking foolishly about that field of study, how will that non-Christian ever take the Christian seriously on issues of the forgiveness of sin, the resurrection of the dead, and everlasting life? There's a need for the church to talk about science intelligently and faithfully, otherwise, we just look either foolish or out of touch to non-Christians, and the Gospel Message will go unheard.

That's why I am inviting people in science and tech fields to talk about where they see God in their scientific or technology field. When people know we are speaking the truth, they will take us more seriously when we share the truth of the Gospel.

Confirmation Reflection: Young People Learn A Lot From Us - Good and Bad

This Fall, I invited the confirmation students to re-order the 10 commandments from the student's highest priority to the lowest. 3 of the 4 students put the 3rd Commandment (keep the Sabbath holy) last, and the 4th student put it 9th out of 10. In reflection, I think the students have learned a lot from us. They don't live in a vacuum. They did not each independently put the Sabbath as such a low priority. We have shown them that we (both in Society and the church) do not take the Sabbath seriously. We have shown them we work a lot and have made work a very high priority in our lives. We can ask ourselves lots of questions - what is more important being productive (get a lot done) or fruitful (get meaningful stuff done, and then rest)? Is it more important to obey God (and the 3rd commandment) or do what we think is best (get stuff done)? Are we talking about the Sabbath at all? If not, why would our young people consider it spiritually important? In reflection, it's clear to me that what we do as a church, how we live as Christians, what we say and don't say, teaches our children a lot!
