With recent changes to co-op hiring processes that have provided us with many spring/summer staff in previous years, there was some concern that staffing may be a challenge this summer. Between increasing staff retention, many LITs (Leader In Training) returning to join the staff team, and staff recruiting friends, we are delighted to have a full staff team in place by the beginning of May! Nearly thirty staff participated in our Spring Training weekend preparing staff for both spring and summer seasons. In the story of Esther, she finds herself in a position of privilege with the ability to potentially save her people from destruction. Her uncle Mordecai sends her a message and says, "For if you keep silent at this time,



relief and deliverance will rise for the Jews from another place." It is both humbling and exciting to be reminded that God may have orchestrated things in such a way as to invite us into the good work being planned, and that God's work will somehow be accomplished regardless of our involvement. I believe that each of the spring/summer staff that have been hired this year are here "for such a time as this" and are being invited to join in God's good work at camp, creating a safe and welcoming place for campers to connect with God, each other, and nature.

Over the past year, we've made exciting progress with our LINC Program. Thanks to the generous support of the

This included hosting our first two overnight LINC Retreats—one in the fall and another in the winter. These retreats offered participants a much-needed opportunity to unwind, connect, and enjoy creative activities like blanket-making and birdhouse building. Families expressed

deep appreciation for the chance to access overnight respite during the fall/winter season.

Our LINC day program has continued to run every Monday and Tuesday, providing a meaningful space to build

relationships and develop new skills throughout the year. Together, we've enjoyed a variety of engaging activities—from beach-themed days and trying out new recipes in the kitchen, to volunteering on camp property and at the MCC Thrift Centre. We've also had fun exploring our creativity through a range of crafts. Meeting weekly with each group has allowed us to deepen our connections and grow together in friendship and community.

We're excited to host our second week of LINC Summer this July. We're hopeful that this time at camp will offer meaningful opportunities for personal growth and leadership development for each participant. As we

come together in intentional community, we look forward to walking with each of the participants as they learn more about themselves, one another, and God.

- completing renovations to a staff house after water damage from a leaking foundation
