

#### THE INVITATION TO HOLY COMMUNION

All baptized Christians from any denomination may receive the Sacrament of Holy Communion. If you are not baptized or you choose not to receive Holy Communion, you may receive a blessing from the priest, signaling this by crossing your arms over your chest.

Please receive the bread only on the palm of your hand.

Please only take wine by drinking from the chalice.

PLEASE DO NOT INTINCT (Do not dip the bread into the wine)

If you choose not to take the wine, you may make a sign of reverence with a simple bow of the head.

By receiving even in one kind (either Bread or Wine), one fully receives the Real Presence of Christ.







THE HOLY GOSPEL MATTHEW 28:1-10

The Holy Gospel of our Savior Jesus Christ according to Matthew. Glory to you, Lord Christ.

After the sabbath, as the first day of the week was dawning, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary went to see the tomb. And suddenly there was a great earthquake; for an angel of the Lord, descending from heaven, came and rolled back the stone and sat on it. His appearance was like lightning, and his clothing white as snow. For fear of him the guards shook and became like dead men. But the angel said to the women, "Do not be afraid; I know that you are looking for Jesus who was crucified. He is not here; for he has been raised, as he said. Come, see the place where he lay. Then go quickly and tell his disciples, 'He has been raised from the dead, and indeed he is going ahead of you to Galilee; there you will see him.' This is my message for you." #### PRESENTATION AND EXAMINATION OF THE CANDIDATE

Priest: The Candidate for Holy Baptism will now be presented.

Parents and Sponsors: I present N. to receive the Sacrament of Baptism.

Will you be responsible for seeing that your child is brought up in the Christian faith and life? *Parents and Sponsors: I will, with God's help.* 

Will you by your prayers and witness help *her* to grow into the full stature of Christ? *Parents and Sponsors: I will, with God's help.* 

Do you renounce Satan and all the spiritual forces of wickedness that rebel against God? *I renounce them.* 

Do you renounce the evil powers of this world which corrupt and destroy the creatures of God? *I renounce them.* 

Do you renounce all sinful desires that draw you from the love of God? *I renounce them.* 

Do you turn to Jesus Christ and accept Him as your Savior? *I do.* 

Do you put your whole trust in His grace and love? *I do*.

Do you promise to follow and obey Him as your Lord? *I do.* 

Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support *this child* in *her* life in Christ? *Congregation: We will.* 

Let us join with *she* who is committing *herself* to Christ and renew our own baptismal covenant.

Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers?

Will you persevere in resisting evil, and, whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord? I will, with God's help.

Will you proclaim by word and example the Good News of God in Christ? I will, with God's help.

Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbor as yourself? I will, with God's help.

Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being?

I will, with God's help.

Through it you led the children of Israel out of their bondage in Egypt into the land of promise. In it your Son Jesus received the baptism of John and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the Christ, to lead us, through his death and resurrection, from the bondage of sin into everlasting life.

We thank you, Father, for the water of Baptism. In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit. Therefore in joyful obedience to your Son, we bring into his fellowship those who come to him in faith, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.
