"But in fact God has placed the parts in the body, every one of them, just as he wanted them to be. If they were all one part, where would the body be? As it is, there are many parts, but one body."

Several years ago, my father and mother in-law asked me what I wanted for Christmas. So, I requested one of those pocketknives that has everything on it that you can imagine: can and bottle opener, pliers, tweezers, toothpick, nail file, screwdriver heads, and a knife. This all-in-one multitool thing claimed that it could do anything. If there was a need for a tool, this thing has what you need, but here's the problem. None of the tools on this multitool pocketknife worked very well. The blades were dull, the screwdriver heads were too small, and everything else was very hard to use. This multitool pocketknife was very versatile, but it didn't do anything well. I ended up throwing that multitool pocketknife in a drawer somewhere. Each tool in my toolbox is a lot better than that multitool pocketknife.

It reminded me of my life and the typical life of a Christian. We want to do everything. We want to be involved in a lot of things. We want to serve God in lots of ways. So, we wear a lot of hats. We juggle a lot responsibilities, but by trying to do so many things, we are not doing each of those things the best we can. God knew that we can't do everything, and so the Holy Spirit gives each of us specific yet different gifts with the understanding that it will take all of us together to do all the work of ministry.

So, instead of focusing on doing a lot in 2024, let us instead focus on our one thing. What is your one thing that you can do for God? Resolve to make a deep impact by doing your one thing in 2024. Do it to the best of your ability, and you're make a tremendous difference for the Kingdom in the coming year through the grace and power of the Holy Spirit! Amen!





#### Trinity's Mission Outreach – Looking Back and Looking Ahead



The members of the Missions Committee (Melissa Clay, Mary Collins, Anna Dunlap, Danny Dunlap, Ruth Girod, Carol Hennis, Warren Kramer, Ben Price, Sue Price, Amy Prichard, Diane Shinn, Larry Webb, Deb Yackee, and Pastor David) would like to take this opportunity to thank you for your mission support in 2023. We would also like to explain how our

mission program works for those of you who may be unaware of this process.

Mission offering is divided into designated and undesignated money. Each month the money that you designate for a particular missionary or organization is sent in full. Money that you designate for a fund known as Share and Care is kept so that it is available to help Trinity families that may need assistance. The Missions Committee meets monthly to decide how the undesignated money will be used based upon current needs of the missionaries/organizations. Some of the undesignated money is carried over each month so that it is available when needed.

As of November 30, the Missions Committee had distributed \$27,000+ to missionaries and organizations. Add to this the items that you have brought to support various mission projects throughout the year, and you know why Trinity is known as a "mission-minded church."

Ask God how He wants you to be involved in Trinity's mission outreach in 2024. No matter how you get involved, you will be blessed in return!

## North Union's Mission Outreach – Looking Back and Looking Ahead



North Union Members also helped with Missions in 2023. Most of their help was for local ministries. We collected items for the food pantry for our quarterly food pantry months, served & provided food for Bread and Bowl, volunteered at the Food Pantry, designated Fifth Sundays as "Mission Sundays" (donating to Families of Addicts, Langdyn House, Sheriff's Auxiliary Christmas for the Kids), took "Love Offerings" for guest missionary speakers, collected brownies for the Salvation Army's Christmas Meals, participated in "Give-a-Christmas", and

donating money from our annual 127 Yard Sale to area ministries.

#### **Operation Back to School**



This is a community outreach that was started in 2016 by 1st UM Church to provide school supplies to needy families. This effort is supported by other area churches, businesses, and individuals.

#### **Salvation Army**



The Salvation Army serves the community in a variety of ways, running a food pantry and offering clothing vouchers, financial assistance, and worship experiences.

#### Van Wert Cooperative Ministry Food Pantry Bread and Bowl meals



Various local churches work together to meet the needs, primarily nutritional, of people in the community. The food pantry is open three days a week and is available to qualifying families once a month. Every Friday night, Bread and Bowl meals are served at 1st UM to anyone who is in need of a nutritious meal and fellowship.

The Cooperative Ministries Food Pantry depends on both monetary donations and donations of items. Monetary donations are used to purchase items both locally and from the West Ohio Food Bank. You can give a monetary donation through your mission offering (just designate "food pantry" on the back of your envelope). You can also purchase items, bring them to church, and place them on the table near the Mission Center. The **focus** for January will be **SOUP**. Of course, other items, as well as plastic bags, are always appreciated too!

#### **Council on Aging Senior Center**



The COA provides valuable assistance to our area senior citizens. Transportation, particularly to medical appointments, is probably the COA's main service, but it also offers nutritious meals, activities, and informational assistance to seniors.



## **Mission News**

#### **PLC Health Clinic**



Now a licensed clinic, the former Pregnancy Life Center is able to offer limited obstetric ultrasounds and STD testing in addition to the support that was already available to families affected by unplanned pregnancies. Clients are encouraged to choose life – either parenting or adoption – rather than abortion. Clients who choose to raise their children can take classes to guide them in their parenting skills, and they can earn "baby

bucks" to buy items at the Baby Store.

#### Langdyn House



The PLC Health Clinic's vision of a home for single pregnant adult women was birthed out of the growing need for safe housing for displaced pregnant women in our community. Upon completion, Langdyn House will provide a home for moms-to-be and moms and their babie and a comprehensive support plan including case management, individual counseling, group therapy,

ramily model mealtime fellowship, and skills coaching.

#### **YWCA**



YWCA programs and services provide women, children, and families with opportunities to improve their lives and increase independence. The facility provides safe, stable housing (emergency and long term) for survivors of domestic violence, human trafficking, and sexual assault. The YWCA also serves as a legislative advocate and holds events throughout the year

to bring awareness to the needs in our community.

#### Love INC (In the Name of Christ)



Love INC is a local clearinghouse that is enabling churches, agencies, and volunteers to help people in need. Clients begin here and then are referred to whatever church, agency, or volunteer can meet their needs. There is always

follow-up to try to help clients deal with their circumstances so as not to always rely on others for help.

#### Gideons



Every year Gideon speakers visit local churches to give an update on their ministry. Bulletin The Gideons inserts are provided so that people can give an offering that will enable the Gideons to print and distribute more Bibles. Throughout the year, cards are available that can be used to furnish Bibles in honor or memory of a person or an occasion.

#### Haven of Hope



Haven of Hope is Van Wert's 1st homeless shelter. Its purpose is to help displaced men in Van Wert County by providing a place to stay and ongoing guidance to obtain the resources necessary to embrace the next chapter of their lives. Its mission is to engage with those who come to Haven of Hope and love them into a more independent and productive life by providing for their spiritual, physical, and emotional needs as children of God.

#### **Gospel Music**



Each year, people who attend the Van Wert County Fair have the opportunity to hear Christian music in the Music Pavilion at no cost, thanks to donations from various churches and individuals.
