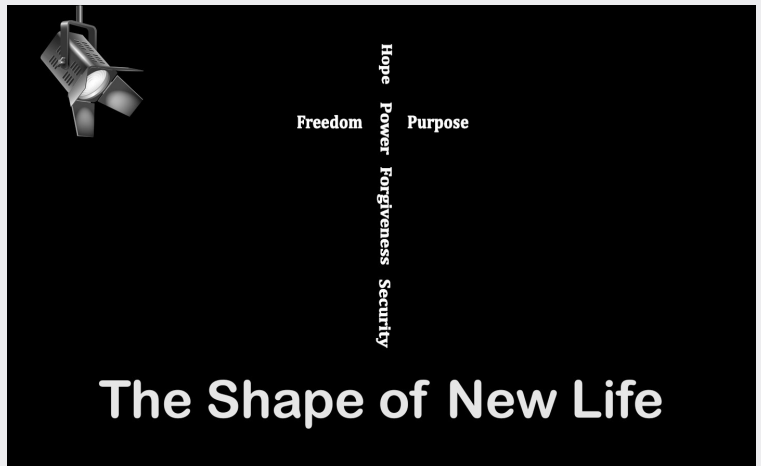

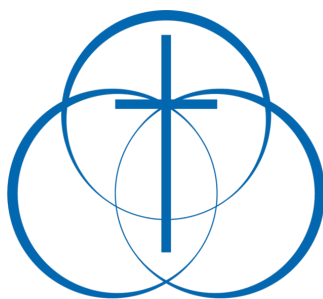


## Outward Focused

So, let us make this next season be a season that is outward focused - helping those in need, sharing the love of Christ, and making new disciples of Jesus who are forever changed. 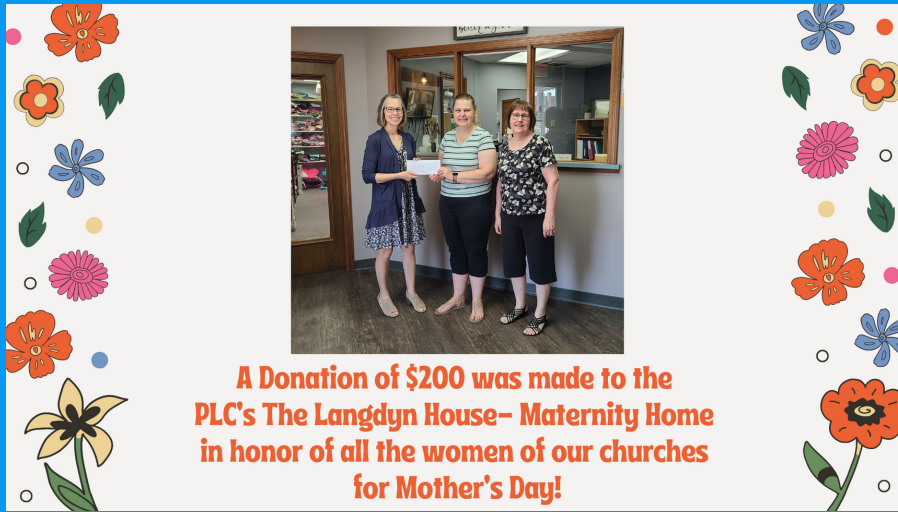

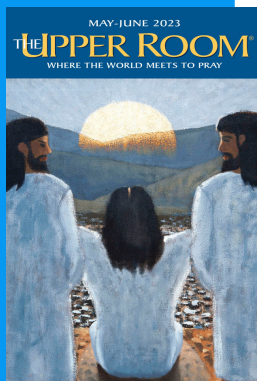


### Upper Room Update:

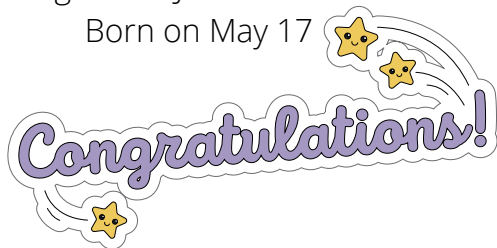
