



Outward Focused

Recently I came across a quote by C.S. Lewis that God used to speak to me concerning the next season we are preparing for. The quote is as following: "If you read history, you will find that the Christians who did most for the present world were those who thought most of the next. The apostle's themselves, who set out on foot to convert the Roman Empire, the great men who built up the Middle Ages, the English evangelicals who abolished the slave trade, all left their mark on earth, precisely because their minds were occupied with Heaven. It is since Christians have largely ceased to think of the other world that they have become ineffective in this one. Aim at heaven and you will get earth 'thrown in.' Aim at earth and you will get neither."


