Pastor's Pen

Looking at Depression

I used to love the winter season. It meant that I could wear my favorite jackets and sweaters, enjoy a warm beverage every night, and get excited about Christmas which is just around the corner. However, in the past few years, I see the winter season as being a big inconvenience. It's too cold to play sports outdoors. I don't feel like running outside or being active, and instead I feel like being at home all the time. It's an inconvenience because I must wait until the weather gets warmer. Another thing that I hate about winter is that there are less hours of the sun. Fewer sunny days. So therefore, I feel a little depressed and have less energy. I know many people feel depressed during the winter season.

Maybe some of us are struggling with depression right now, or maybe we know someone who is struggling with that. Maybe we have thought does God really understand our human experience of depression? The fact is Jesus has experienced a human life and experience the things we go through in life while He was here on earth while still being 100% God and at the same time 100% human. Not only does Jesus understands, but God knows more about our depression, anxiety, despair, and sadness than anyone else in this world, and God has provided a framework in His word so we can understand how to approach this struggle.

Here are 3 people in the Bible who struggled with depression:

1. Job

Job is the oldest book in the Bible. And it's all about suffering. The story starts with Job who was a rich, healthy, and blessed man. He was "blameless and upright, one who feared God and turned away from evil." Then one day, Job's life falls apart. Foreigners kill his servants and steal all of his animals (aka his livelihood). Then a great wind comes up and pulls down the house on his family, killing his seven sons and three daughters. And to top things off, Job ends up with boils all over his body. And we think our lives are difficult! He ends up writing really depressing poetry. In Job 30:16-20 he says, "Depression haunts my days. At night my bones are filled with pain, which gnaws at me relentlessly. With a strong hand, God grabs my shirt. He grips me by the collar of my coat. He has thrown me into the mud. I'm nothing more than dust and ashes....I cry to You, O God, but You don't answer. I stand before You, but You don't even look." You may relate to Job if you feel constant sadness. It may seem as if every day is filled with sadness and depression, and you may even believe that God is absent.

2. Elijah

Elijah saw God do the most incredible things, like send fire down from heaven to win a duel against the false prophets. We think that his spirit would be so high from these mountain top experiences. However, right after experiencing that win against the false prophets, he was overwhelmed with fear, unsure that God is going to protect him. He was afraid for his life and begins to experience suffering. Amid that suffering, Elijah finds himself reaching the point of, "I don't want to live anymore." In 1 Kings 19:4 he cries out, "I have had enough, LORD...Take my life, for I am no better than my ancestors who have already died." You may relate to Elijah if you've ever thought, "I am all alone. I can't take it anymore. I don't want to live anymore. There's no point."

3. King David

David wrote most of the Psalms, and he was probably the most emotional person in the whole Bible - up and down, up and down. One minute he is praising God, and the next he is like, "Where are You, God?!" He feels like God has turned His back on him and claims that his life is full of depression and sadness. In Psalm 6:5-7 David's words ring, "I am worn out from sobbing. All night I flood my bed with weeping, drenching it with my tears. My vision is blurred by grief." He becomes overwhelmed with sadness and unable to sleep. Yet, God calls him "a man after his own heart" (1 Samuel 13:14). You may relate to King David if you've ever just felt exhausted from grief or felt like you can't even sleep.

The Bible is full of men and women who are not immune or unaware of what it's like to experience sorrow, pain, and depression. God made sure that these true stories were included in the Bible, partly so that you would know you're not alone. Depression can come for anyone. God doesn't want you to experience depression, and He also understands what you're walking through. He is merciful, gracious, and empathizes with what you're going through (Hebrews 4:14-16). Even in depression, Jesus is your healer and hope in the darkness. Cry out to God in prayer when you're feeling depressed and focus on the truth in His word. He will work all things together for good for those who love Him. And one day for you and all believers, He'll wipe every tear from our eyes in heaven. Hold on to that hope and keep fighting depression with the help of God's Spirit (who dwells in you), His people, His word, and the tools of the medical world. God loves you, and your life has purpose! Having faith means to not give up but to continue onward because you believe in God!






Shut In Spotlight

Trinity's Food Pantry Focus


The Focus for March is Detergent and Paper Products.

Brian and Beth Schwartz Wycliffe Bible Translators – the Philippines



A Translation and Literacy Milestone is Marked by Partnership

An event will be held on March 8th and 9th celebrating the 25th anniversary of the Obo Manobo Active Language Resource and Community Development, Inc. (OMALRACDI). The translation is a collaborative effort between several organizations, churches, and individuals. The translation of the New Testament demanded great collaboration, and now we are looking to God to see who He brings together to accomplish the Old Testament translation

for the Obo Manobo people.

High School Outdoor Education Recently, Brian was able to take a break from his administrative tasks and went with the high school students for their annual outdoor education (OE) trip. OE is an opportunity for students to learn and interact with the local culture and community, to serve others, and to focus on their spiritual development. Due to recent flooding in the Davao area, the students helped to clean up from the flooding in a nearby neighborhood where nine of our national staff live. Then, we traveled about two hours north of Davao to help a local ministry. Work projects included pouring cement for a parking lot, sorting and organizing books, building a storage room, and dismantling a house. Brian was in-charge of tearing down the house. The ministry wanted to reuse as many of the materials as could be saved, which meant being strategic in tearing it down. Thank you for journeying with us in translating God's love into words, actions, time, and finances as we impact the Bible-less people groups together in the Philippines.

An Update from Mary Collins, Trinity's Missions Chairperson



In the January and February newsletters, I gave a summary of Trinity's 2023 mission outreach and highlighted the missionaries and organizations that were supported both financially and otherwise throughout the year. Recently, someone suggested that I provide specific information to enable everyone, especially those who are new to Trinity, to better understand our outreach ministry. I have tried to include everything as I reflect on 2023, but even if I've forgotten to mention something, this will give you a good idea

of how "our hands" are helping to do "God's work."

Note: Although the financial information given is specific to Trinity, I want to acknowledge and thank North Union for partnering with Trinity in some of the areas listed below.

Local Outreach (money amounts indicate annual giving through mission offering)

- Van Wert Cooperative Ministries
- Bread and Bowl meals volunteers serve 4-5 times a year; food is purchased with undesignated mission offering (\$963)


