These stories are a powerful reminder that loving through service truly makes a difference. **How Would You Like to Love and Serve Others in 2026?** Below are opportunities to serve through our Ministry of H.O.P.E. (Helping Others by Praying & Encouraging) Congregational Care program:

**COMMUNION TEAM** - Serve by delivering Communion boxes on the first Sunday of each month to church members and residents of nursing homes and assisted living facilities. Another opportunity includes helping prepare Communion boxes quarterly for shut-ins.

**L.Y.F.T. MINISTRY** (Living Your Faith Transporting) Adult drivers are needed to provide transportation for older adults on Sunday mornings so they can attend worship in person.

**VISITATION TEAM** - Visitors are needed to make monthly visits that include serving Communion and delivering Ministry of H.O.P.E. holiday gifts to shut-ins, assisted living facilities, and nursing homes.

**HOSPITAL VISITATION TEAM** - Volunteers are needed to make monthly visits to local hospitals.

**CARD MINISTRY TEAM** - Those who enjoy sending greeting cards to encourage and uplift others are always welcome and greatly needed.

## **HAPPY 200<sup>TH</sup> BIRTHDAY FIRST METHODIST MONROE**

Grace and peace to you, First Methodist Monroe family. As we step into 2026, we begin a year unlike any other in the life of our congregation: our 200th Bicentennial. This sacred milestone invites us to remember God's faithfulness across two centuries and to imagine how God will continue shaping us in the years ahead. Our celebration will conclude with a time of singing and devotion in the sanctuary, followed by a brief fireworks display over the bayou.

# LOVE IS A VERB

Don't just pretend to love others. Really love them. Hate what is wrong. Hold tightly to what is good. Love each other with genuine affection, and take delight in

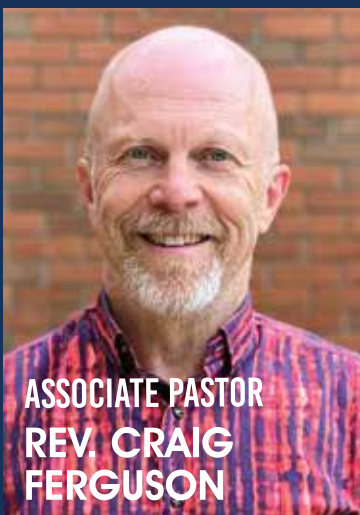
honoring each other. Never be lazy, but work hard and serve the Lord enthusiastically. Rejoice in our confident hope. Be patient in trouble, and keep on praying. When God's people are in need, be ready to help them. Always be eager to practice hospitality. Bless those who persecute you. Don't curse them; pray that God will bless them. Be happy with those who are happy, and weep with those who weep. Live in harmony with each other. Don't be too proud to enjoy the company of ordinary people. And don't think you know it all! Never pay back evil with more evil. Do things in such a way that everyone can see you are honorable. Do all that you can to live in peace with everyone. - Romans 12:9-18

This passage is a calling to put our love into action. When God calls us to love our neighbor, He expects that love to look different—to be visible, intentional, and Christ-shaped. In this passage, Paul exhorts us to love the way Christ loves us: with sincere love. Not perfect love—but love that is genuine, without hypocrisy. When we love others well, our love seeks to honor them, not elevate ourselves. Imagine being part of a community where people are competing—not for recognition—but to outdo one another in honoring others. Volunteers, coworkers, older adults, young people—everyone held in high esteem. That's a community worth belonging to. That's a church worth building.

In his book *Saved by Faith and Hospitality*, Joshua Jipp writes:

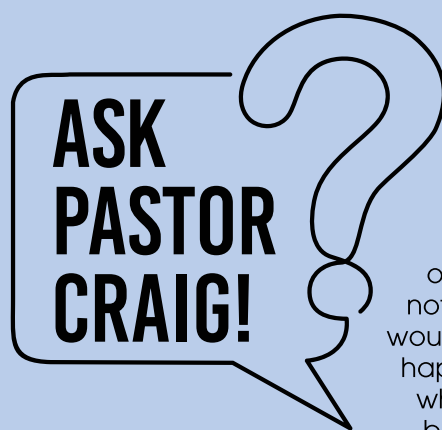
*"God's hospitality is extended to His lost, broken, needy, and often stigmatized people. This divine hospitality comes to us in the person of Jesus, the divine host who extends God's hospitality to sinners, outcasts, and strangers and thereby draws them—and us—into friendship with God. God's embrace of humanity into friendship with Him is the ultimate form of welcoming the stranger."*

When we love our neighbors well, we embrace, forgive, and extend grace the same way Jesus has shown it to us. My prayer is that God would use our faith family to extend this kind of love—active, sincere, Christlike love—to our neighbors and our community.

Welcome to our new column, a place where your real questions meet honest, biblical answers for everyday faith.

**Question:** How do I deal with past hurt I've experienced in church or from Christians?

Let me say this upfront: if you've been hurt by church leaders or a church community, that pain is real and it matters. You're not being too sensitive, and you're definitely not alone. Church wounds cut differently than other kinds of hurt because they happen in a place that's supposed to be safe—among people who are supposed to reflect Christ's love. When that trust gets broken, it can shake everything.

This is crucial: flawed leaders and broken communities don't define who God is. The pastor who failed you isn't Jesus. The church that wounded you isn't the Church. They're human beings who sometimes represent themselves instead of Christ. Importantly, God is grieved by what happened to you. The same Jesus who overturned tables when religious leaders exploited people is angry about Christian leaders who hurt people today.

Here's where church culture sometimes gets it wrong: we pressure people to forgive and reconcile, as if they're the same thing. Forgiveness is releasing your right to revenge and choosing not to let bitterness poison your soul. It's something you do with God's help to keep you from being captive to the person who hurt you, and it's often a process. You can forgive someone and still maintain boundaries. You can forgive someone and never put yourself back in a position where they can hurt you again. That's not unChristian; that's wisdom.

The great tragedy of church hurt is that it makes people leave church altogether. Before walking away from faith completely, ask yourself: Am I leaving Jesus, or am I leaving what these people said about Jesus? Read the Gospels with fresh eyes. Pay attention to how Jesus actually treated people wounded by religious leaders. Every church has broken people who sometimes do things that cause pain. But the Church is bigger than any single congregation or leader. God is still good, still present, still redemptive—even when his people aren't. He is the God who heals. Church is the place God designed for us to learn how to do that. Cling to it; don't run from it. 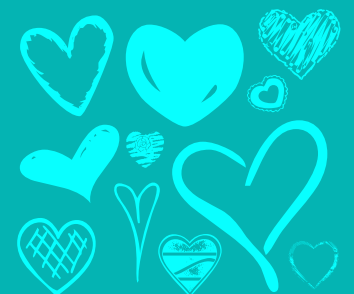
