

GLORIA GARDEN MEMORIAL BRICKS

SOWING IN THE SEASON OF HARVEST

Fall is here, First Methodist Monroe! Recently, I read the following description of this much-anticipated season: "As the leaves turn gold and the air grows crisp, we enter the beautiful season of harvest—a time when the fields yield their bounty and we pause to marvel at God's provision. In Scripture, harvest imagery reminds us that every blessing we enjoy stems from the seeds He has sown in our lives." This October, here at First Methodist Monroe, let us lean into this truth and consider how our giving reflects both gratitude and trust in the One who provides abundantly.

In Malachi 3:10 we read God's invitation: "Bring the full tithe into the store-house, that there may be food in my house. And thereby put me to the test." Through this call to a full tithe, the Lord assures us that when we honor Him with the first and best of our increase, He will open the windows of heaven and pour out a blessing until there is no more need. Tithing isn't a legalistic requirement but a joyful response to His faithfulness.

Paul echoes this heart posture in 2 Corinthians 9:7: "Each one must give as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver." Our giving springs from worship—an act of trust that says, "God, I believe You are my Provider, and I want my resources to advance Your Kingdom." When we give cheerfully, we join in God's work of making disciples, feeding the hungry, and offering hope to a hurting world.


As the harvest season surrounds us with reminders of completion and fruitfulness, let us reflect on God's work in our lives this year. Which fields has He brought from planting to harvest? Where has He sustained you through drought? As you pause to count your blessings, prayerfully consider how a full 10% tithe can deepen your reliance on Him and fuel ministry at First Methodist Monroe.
