Call to Worship: “Do You Hear What I Hear”

*Gathering Responses:

P: Why have we gathered from far and near- online and in person?

C: **To bring our worship and joy, to welcome the new baby boy.**

P: Where shall we find Him?

C: **Joseph and Mary sheltered by a makeshift stall, hold in their arms the Saviour of all!**

P: How shall we greet Him – the Prince of Peace, the Lord of All?

C: **With our praise and thanks, with wonder and awe. Humbly we greet Him, hearts open wide – recognizing without fully understanding; that both our need and God’s grace are great.**

P: We are gathered this night from near and far, in our homes, in the Sanctuary, wherever we find ourselves around the globe, to worship the Lord and celebrate His birth. We let go of fear and embrace faith, as we come in from the dark and draw near to the Light.

C: **We join those who made the first journey to the manger so many years ago.**

P: In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Song of Truth: “You Can’t Stop Christmas From Coming”

Confession of Sins & Forgiveness:

P: Our wreath shines bright as we light four candles – hope, peace, joy, and love (*candles are lit*) This season of Advent has drawn us into God’s Word. We have pondered the mystery of ancient prophecy and the depth of God’s promise given. We have been preparing our hearts by exploring ‘*The Glory of Christmas*’.

C: **We have considered how timely God’s Word is to us today. In Mary, in Joseph, and in the Shepherd, we have been able to find ourselves – our fears and our faith. We have pondered the glory, the ‘weight’ of the angel messengers, “Do not be afraid.” We are honest to admit that in the year 2020 we have strained to hear the angel’s message.**

P: “Do not be afraid” is easier said than done. We remember that Jesus is named, Emmanuel – God with us, and we give thanks for His presence. We light the Christ Candle (white candle) and join in saying,

C: **Happy Birthday dear Jesus!**

P: Our approach to the manger is bittersweet. The baby fills us with joy, the reason He came brings pain. It is for sinners that Jesus came, it is for you and me that this gift is given. God sent His Son to be the Saviour of the world, keeping His promise to Adam and Eve. God made a way home.

C: **Beyond the manger wood we see the shadow of a wooden cross. We come humbled and honest, aware of our sins and sorry for them. We do not deserve this gift. We ask God’s forgiveness.**

P: I have incredibly Good News to share, God sent Jesus, vulnerable babe, to live as one of us and to bear all our sins upon Himself, suffering and dying on the cross. Jesus rose from the dead crushing death’s power over us. As a called minister in Christ’s church and by Christ’s authority it is my joy tonight to give to you the greatest gift you will ever receive - your sins are forgiven. Be not be afraid; for Christ is with you.

God's Promise: Isaiah 9:2b,6-7

The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who lived in a land of deep darkness— on them light has shined. ⁶For a child has been born for us, a son given to us; authority rests upon his shoulders; and he is named Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. ⁷His authority shall grow continually, and there shall be endless peace for the throne of David and his kingdom. He will establish and uphold it with justice and with righteousness from this time onward and forevermore. The zeal of the Lord of hosts will do this.

A Christmas Story: "Trees & Gears & Crowns, Oh my!"

Christmas Gospel : Luke 2:1-7

In those days a decree went out from Emperor Augustus that all the world should be registered. ²This was the first registration and was taken while Quirinius was governor of Syria. ³All went to their own towns to be registered. ⁴Joseph also went from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to the city of David called Bethlehem, because he was descended from the house and family of David. ⁵He went to be registered with Mary, to whom he was engaged and who was expecting a child. ⁶While they were there, the time came for her to deliver her child. ⁷And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in bands of cloth, and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn.

Children's Carol: "Away in a Manger"

Christmas Gospel: Luke 2:8-18

In that region there were shepherds living in the fields, keeping watch over their flock by night. ⁹Then an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. ¹⁰But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid; for see—I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: ¹¹to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord. ¹²This will be a sign for you: you will find a child wrapped in bands of cloth and lying in a manger." ¹³And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host, praising God and saying, ¹⁴"Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace among those whom he favors!" ¹⁵When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let us go now to Bethlehem and see this thing that has taken place, which the Lord has made known to us." ¹⁶So they went with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the child lying in the manger. ¹⁷When they saw this, they made known what had been told them about this child; ¹⁸and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds told them.

But Mary treasured all these words and pondered them in her heart. ²⁰The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, as it had been told them.

P: *"God abides in those who confess that Jesus is the Son of God, and they abide in God".*

C: *"There is no fear in love, but perfect love casts out fear. We love because God first loved us."*

P: *Jesus Christ is 'The Light that shines in the darkness,*

C: ***And the darkness did not overcome it.'***

Carol of Light: "Silent Night, Holy Night"

Prayer:

P: Maranatha! The Lord is Come. Let heaven and earth rejoice. We pray,

C: **Heavenly Father thank you for the wonder and joy of this holy night. Thank you for the 'Glory' of Christmas. No other gift has been more important to the world than the baby Mary bore – the child in the manger, God's own Son. By the power of Your Holy Spirit help us to receive and share this Good News with the openness of Mary, the obedience of Joseph and the joy of the shepherds. Give us faith over fear as you did for each of them, so that our lives may bring praise and glory to Your name and all may come to know Jesus! Amen.**
