^Opening Responses & Lighting of the Candle of HOPE

- P: Blessed be the Holy Trinity, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, One God, Who creates, redeems, and sustains us and all of creation.
- C: Amen.
- P: Stir up our hearts O God, that we may be messengers of Your hope and light amid a dark and often dangerous world.
- C: By the power of Your Holy Spirit, the Spirit of wisdom and understanding, the Spirit of counsel and might, the Spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord, may Your Gospel promise to us be daily heard, and our faith strengthened, that we may bring hope in Jesus' name.
- P: Keep us vigilant and joyful, living in the expectant hope of Your good and glorious day, when Jesus, our Incarnate LORD, whose birth we prepare to celebrate shall come again in glory as He has promised and take us home! Amen.

*Confession of Sin & Absolution:

- P: Let us confess our sins before God our Father.
- C: We confess that we have wandered far from you, our true home. We have sought security, meaning, and belonging apart from you. We have listened to sin's whispers and followed our own desires. We are exiled by our rebellion, and we cannot bring ourselves back. Forgive us, Lord, for the sake of Jesus Christ.

Silence for reflection

- P: Hear the good news. God has not abandoned you in exile. In Christ Jesus, the shoot from Jesse's stump, he has come to you. By his death and resurrection, your sins are forgiven. The door to the Father's home stands open, and you are welcomed inside. As a called and ordained servant of Christ, and by his authority, I therefore forgive you all your sins, in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.
- C: Amen.

God's Word: Isaiah 11:1-10

A shoot shall come out from the stump of Jesse, and a branch shall grow out of his roots. ²The spirit of the Lord shall rest on him, the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord. ³His delight shall be in the fear of the Lord. He shall not judge by what his eyes see, or decide by what his ears hear; ⁴but with righteousness he shall judge the poor, and decide with equity for the meek of the earth; he shall strike the earth with the rod of his mouth, and with the breath of his lips he shall kill the wicked. ⁵Righteousness shall be the belt around his waist, and faithfulness the belt around his loins. ⁶The wolf shall live with the lamb, the leopard shall lie down with the kid, the calf and the lion and the fatling together, and a little child shall lead them. ⁷The cow and the bear shall graze, their young shall lie down together; and the lion shall eat straw like the ox. ⁸The nursing child shall play over the hole of the asp, and the weaned child shall put its hand on the adder's den. ⁹They will not hurt or destroy on all my holy mountain; for the earth will be full of the knowledge of the Lord as the waters cover the sea.

¹⁰On that day the root of Jesse shall stand as a signal to the peoples; the nations shall inquire of him, and his dwelling shall be glorious.

Holy Gospel: Matthew 24:36-44

"But about that day and hour no one knows, neither the angels of heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father. ³⁷For as the days of Noah were, so will be the coming of the Son of Man. ³⁸For as in those days before the flood they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, until the day Noah entered the ark, ³⁹and they knew nothing until the flood came and swept them all away, so too will be the coming of the Son of Man. ⁴⁰Then two will be in the field; one will be taken and one will be left. ⁴¹Two women will be grinding meal together; one will be taken and one will be left. ⁴²Keep awake therefore, for you do not know on what day your Lord is coming. ⁴³But understand this: if the owner of the house had known in what part of the night the thief was coming, he would have stayed awake and would not have let his house be broken into. ⁴⁴Therefore you also must be ready, for the Son of Man is coming at an unexpected hour.






