P: In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

L: Praise the Lord! I will give thanks to the Lord with my whole heart, in the company of the upright, in the congregation.

C: that we can falter in our trust of Your abundant provision in all areas of our lives. We can abuse Your good creation for our own benefits and we are slow to welcome those different from ourselves. We often balk at extending forgiveness to our neighbour despite our desire to be forgiven by You. We have sinned against You in thought, word and deed; we are sinful by nature and cannot save ourselves.

P: Lord God, I am sorry for my sin and ask Your forgiveness.

C: Lord God, I am sorry for my sin and ask Your forgiveness.

All: In Jesus' name, we pray. Amen.

P: Beloved of God, it is with great joy that I, a called and ordained minister in the Church of Christ and by Christ's authority, declare to You the entire forgiveness of all your sins. Through Christ Jesus Who is the atoning sacrifice for our sins, the scandalous gift of God's grace, we have received peace with God. Let us now live in hope.

C: For hope does not disappoint, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit. (Romans 5:5)

Holy Gospel: John 6:25-35

When they found him on the other side of the sea, they said to him, "Rabbi, when did you come here?" ²⁶Jesus answered them, "Very truly, I tell you, you are looking for me, not because you saw signs, but because you ate your fill of the loaves. ²⁷Do not work for the food that perishes, but for the food that endures for eternal life, which the Son of Man will give you. For it is on him that God the Father has set his seal."

²⁸Then they said to him, "What must we do to perform the works of God?" ²⁹Jesus answered them, "This is the work of God, that you believe in him whom he has sent." ³⁰So they said to him, "What sign are you going to give us then, so that we may see it and believe you?
