

Do you recognize this sign? Agonizing over my pastor's letter for September I took a break and meandered through the fellowship hall as I do when I hit writer's block. I looked up and noticed (again) that the left side of this banner was coming loose. And in that wee observance I knew what this letter should be about – God's purpose for our church and how long it has been since we have spent quality time wrestling with (striving over) what that means for us today.

These banners went up many years ago and a great deal of time, prayer, faith and wrestling went into the final product. This is the way of God's people – praying, believing, wrestling and affirming our walk with Christ as a gathered community of faith, even as we are always changing and re-arranging. We are held to Jesus' own words as to what it is we are to be about as His body, the Church. He is very clear in Matthew 28:16-20, as He begins with these words – "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations". A disciple is one who believes in and assists in spreading the teachings (doctrine) of another. One definition of a Christian disciple is one who has been made a new creation in Christ, who is following Christ and who is committed to the mission of Christ. Jesus told his followers on the mountain as He prepared to return to His Father, 'go' and 'make' disciples of all nations. As they returned to their daily lives and as they went to new places, they had a mutual purpose, a calling, a commissioning by Christ to be making disciples. And here is the phenomenally cool thing about this – we do too!

How? How is this done, this disciple making? Who has that kind of power or authority to 'make' someone be something? Jesus goes on to tell them how this will be accomplished. "Baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you." Disciples are made in baptism and nurtured through the teaching of God's two Words of Law and Gospel. God by His Holy Spirit working through baptism and the efficacy of God's Word makes disciples – transforming sinners into children of God, who are also heirs of salvation and bearers of the Gospel, the Good News of Christ. God nurtures and sustains His people at the table of the Lord where we receive forgiveness of sins through Christ's own body and blood given in, with and under bread and wine. This is us – the body of Christ called and commissioned.

Now back to our sign which is drooping! When was the last time we gathered and wrestled with God's purpose for us here at Trinity? Think about it. When did you last give of your time and your gifts to join your faith family in taking stock and re-affirming the Lord's vision for our ministry here in Brooks. In Proverbs 29:18 we read, "without a vision the people perish." Fall is the beginning of a new season. Each of our families are 'visioning' what this coming year will look like for them. What sports will be played, what extra-curricular activities will happen, which exercise class to take, what trips will be taken and what projects undertaken. This all requires visioning – looking forward into the future where time keeps on slipping. It needs planning, commitment and follow-through with intentionality or it WILL NOT HAPPEN.

Consider the sign above. Does it speak clearly about whose we are and what we have been commissioned to do? Is God's purpose for our church to 'love one another' only? Are we a congregation faithful and eager for worship, for study, for fellowship and service? I believe we are, yet I know we would benefit greatly from some wrestling and intentional effort in our follow-through. The power to make disciples who then grow in trust and faith is always God's. God has chosen to work through the means of Word and Sacrament. It is uncanny how our faith deepens when we are consistently in His Word, with His people and dining at His table. It is a God designed thing actually! When we are distracted by so many other things we are the ones who miss out on all God has in store for us.

As Fall begins, I ask you to be ardent in prayer about the following. What are the current needs in our community? Who are those that need our love and service? Where might we 'go' and make disciples by sharing the Gospel? How might we do that? Come and share your thoughts and ideas.

Let's also take stock individually. If you are not involved in a weekly Bible study, then ask yourself 'why am I not'? Is your response to all of God's good gifts to you minimal or sacrificial? Are you willing to gather and wrestle with Trinity's future directions? How do we move forward into the unknown together? Come and share your wrestling with me – that's what pastors are for! Let's pray together. Share your ideas with members of Council. In the last verse of Matthew 28:16-20 Jesus shares a command with a promise. His command is for us to 'remember', to never lose His final words, "I am with you always, to the end of the age." In this promise is the strength, courage and hope that enables us to indeed vision together, to 'go' as He leads us and to 'make disciples' as Jesus commanded – baptizing and teaching. NOTE FROM CHURCH COUNCIL PRESIDENT

Dear Members of Trinity Lutheran Church,

As your Church Council President and also as the Chair of the Transition Team, I would like to update you on some of the exciting things that have been happening over the last few months. As you are aware, the Transition Team was formed about six years ago with the purpose of searching for a lead pastor for our congregation. At that time, Pastor John indicated that he would like to move towards retirement with a reduced workload, and Pastor Maggie was called to become our Pastor while we looked for a Senior Pastor. She was willing to become our Pastor with the plan that when a Senior Pastor was called, she would step into an Assisting Pastor role, and we would thus have two pastors for our congregation. Our congregation certainly is large enough to warrant two pastors.

While the Transition Team has been very active in looking for a pastor to call, many things seem to have been in our path. The Covid Pandemic certainly interfered with any pastor being open to move to a new congregation. There is a severe shortage of pastors these days, and God has not to this date led us to one who would be willing to relocate and who was a fit for our needs.

While we continue to search for a pastor to call, we have also looked at other ways that the congregation's needs can be met.

These are the things that have happened which we pray will help us to grow as a congregation and to follow Jesus's direction to bring the good news of a Saviour to our community.

- Sarah Summach is in the position of Worship and Communications Minister. Sarah is involved in planning worship services, ensuring that our communication to congregants is current and available, and coordination and planning with the music and sound room volunteers. She has an amazing capacity to ensure that our worship services and other activities are coordinated with Pastor Maggie. We are so very blessed to have Sarah's wisdom and knowledge at work in our congregation!
- Maddie Anderson has been our Parish Worker for most of the
 past two years. In a part time position, she has been assisting
 with youth programming, visiting members at home and working
 with newcomers in an English as a Second Language program.
 Maddie is a graduate of CLBI (Canadian Lutheran Bible
 Institute). We are blessed to have her in our congregation and
 appreciate her quiet and loving approach to all she does.
- Rebecca Saltvold- VBS and Youth ministry for the Summer 2025: Rebecca was with us for three weeks to help with VBS and other Youth related activities. We are thankful for Rebecca's willingness to help us during a very busy time of the year!

- Erin Haag, who has been a member of our congregation for several years is now married and living in Kamloops. She has made the prayerful decision to begin her education with ILT (Institute of Lutheran Theology), a US based Lutheran online education that will give her a Master of Divinity on completion. We were able to assist her through our TLC Scholarship Fund. Our prayers are with Erin as she begins this exciting journey in her life.
- Liam Anderson, has indicated an interest in furthering his education through CLBI (Canadian Lutheran Bible Institute), focusing on Youth Ministry. This program requires that the student have a host congregation and mentors in that congregation. Liam will be hosted by our congregation and will be mentored by Pastor Maggie and Pastor John. Liam also has received support for his tuition through the TLC Scholarship Fund. While Liam is working on his courses he will be employed part time by our congregation to be a Ministry Intern (Youth and Family). You will see him working with the Youth and involved in worship services. We are so fortunate to have Liam in our midst, full of energy and willing to be ministering to our Youth!
- Pastor Ed Skutshek, who lives in Kelowna, has been the
 Transition Team's advisor and guide. He has helped us to
 interview potential pastoral candidates for call and has been a
 wise resource as we work through the challenges of our search.
 We are thankful for his guidance and wisdom. And just an
 interesting note, he is currently the serving Pastor for the
 Kamloops St. Andrew's Lutheran Church and is Erin Haag's
 mentor for her studies with ILT!
- Pastor Maggie and Pastor John are our current pastoral team.
 Pastor Maggie is our Senior Pastor and Pastor John is Pastor Emeritus. We are so blessed by God to have them as our pastoral team! Pastor Maggie gives countless hours preparing for our worship services, caring for our congregation in sickness and in health, and in guiding us as we move along the path that God has for us. Pastor John continues to assist with needs in our congregation and support for Pastor Maggie.

As you can see, we are a busy congregation. Although God has not seen it as time to provide us with a pastor to call, He has guided us into different ways to meet the needs of our congregation and community. We are contributing to the training and education of future pastors, and that is such an important thing for us to do! Please ask questions of me, your Council, and Transition Team. We need your prayers and your input into the plans for our congregation. God is leading us and in confidence we will continue to move forward!

Have you ever committed Bible Roulette?

Have you ever opened your Bible and asked the following or similar questions: What does this passage really mean? How does it apply to my life?

[These questions are from a study Bible (in this case the Life Application Study Bible). While there are many study Bibles, I would recommend the Lutheran Study Bible as the perspectives in it reflect the teachings of our church more closely.]

I contend that many of us stop reading the Word of God on a regular basis and thus play the guessing game (Bible roulette). What we really need is to dig deeper into striving to hear the Creator and understanding His Word to us! Because of the many pressures in life many of us haven't taken advantage of daily reading of the Scriptures, often and with good reason called devotions.

God urges us to rely upon and apply His Word in passages such as 1 Corinthians 10:11, Romans 15:4 and 2 Timothy 3:14-17. Even so some stop with accumulating Bible knowledge. Having Bible knowledge is a good thing but it's even better when that knowledge is used to share its application and to exhort us to put it into practice. The study and application of God's Word is a usual part of one's relationship with Him. The difficulty we may often have in understanding and applying the Bible to our lives is not the Bible itself. It usually reflects the reader's inability to bridge the gap between the past and the present, the conceptual and the practical. It is important to understand that it isn't up to us to create an understanding of the Word. God the Holy Spirit supplies the grace and ability to do so through the Word itself, providing the interpretation of His meaning through the whole Bible. That is, the Bible interprets itself!


