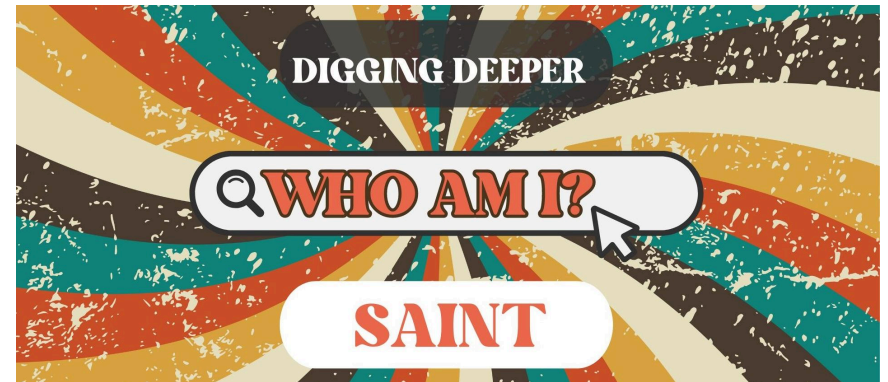


1. In what ways do you try in your own strength to measure up to others and God? Does this take you towards pride or despair?
