## The Lighting and Blessing of the New Fire

Through light and word, through water, bread and wine, let us celebrate the new life that Christ shares with us.

#### The fire is lighted.

On this most holy night, When Jesus passed from death to life, we come together as his disciples in vigil and prayer.

The fire is blessed.

God, Creator of Darkness and Light, we share in the light of Your glory through Jesus, the light of the world. Make this fire holy + and inflame us with Your spirit of new hope.

Christ, yesterday and today, the beginning and the end, the Alpha and the Omega. All time belongs to You and all ages.

The Paschal Candle is lit from the newly kindled fire.

O Christ, may Your rising in glory, enlighten our hearts and minds, and illuminate our ways.

#### **Presider**

Holy One, Blessed are you and all Creation: the vast expanse of interstellar space, galaxies, stars, the planets in their courses and this fragile earth, our island home. You are unceasingly at work, bringing order from chaos and filling emptiness with life. Your love restores our broken world. Your Chosen One, Jesus the Christ, raised from the dead, proclaims the dawn of hope. Your Spirit dwells within us and Your breath warms our hearts to love as You do. And so we join with all of creation, on earth and throughout the cosmos, and with all those in every generation who have looked to You in hope, in singing this unending song of praise:

**Voice 2:** Jesus renewed the promise of his presence, making himself known in the breaking of the bread, speaking peace to the fearful disciples, welcoming weary fishermen on the shore. On the night before he died, he gathered with his friends to share a final Passover meal.

## Please extend your hand, palm up, toward the bread and wine.

**Presider:** We recognize Your Spirit alive and at work in this bread and wine, and in us. We open ourselves to Your Spirit who sanctifies and transforms these gifts to become You in us, the body and blood of Christ. We remember that...

All: ... On the night of his betrayal, Jesus shared a meal with his friends. He took bread, blessed it, broke it, gave it to his disciples, saying: "This is my body. Do this in memory of me."

## [Pause]

In the same way, Jesus took the cup filled with wine. He gave You thanks, and gave the cup to his friends, saying: "Take this all of you and drink. This is my life-blood; the cup of Love. Do this in memory of me."

Let us proclaim the mystery of faith: [Sung] Mass of St. Ann

We proclaim your death, O Christ, and profess your Resurrection until you come again, until you come again.

**Voice 1:** Let Your Spirit also come upon all leaders secular and religious. Catch all of them by surprise. Fill their hearts with a longing for equality and justice. Imbue them with the joy of divine diversity. Bestow on them the wealth of humble service to others. Make them faithful servants of the body of Christ.

**Voice 2:** We remember everyone who has touched our lives with the Spirit of Your love. Be with all who are sick and all who suffer. Be with all who have died and gone before us into the fullness of cosmic life with You.

**Presider:** Gather together people of every gender, race, language, religion and way of life to share in Your one unending banquet. In Your presence, we give You glory with all creation and with Jesus through whom Your goodness flows.

Through Christ, may all creation unfold; With Christ, may all creation be one; In Christ, may all divisions be healed; In the unity of the Holy Spirit, may all glory and honor be Yours, forever and ever:
