

~ LITURGY OF THE WORD ~

First Reading Deut 18:15-22

A Reading from the Book of Deuteronomy

Moses said to the people, "The Holy One, your God, will raise up for you a prophet like me from among the people, one to whom you will listen.

"This is what you requested of the Holy One, your God, at Horeb. On the day of the Assembly you said, 'If we hear the voice of the Holy One, our God, anymore, or ever again see this great fire, we will die.' Then God said to me, 'What they have said is well said. And so, I will raise up for them a prophet like you from among their own people. I will put my words in the mouth of the prophet, who will tell them everything my heart desires. Anyone who does not heed the words that the prophet speaks in my Name, I myself will hold accountable. But the prophet who speaks in the name of other gods, or presumes to speak in my Name a word that I have not spoken - that prophet will perish.'

"You may say to yourself, 'How can we know if it is a word that God has not spoken?' If a prophet speaks in the Name of God, but the thing does not take place or prove true, it is a word that God has not spoken. The prophet has spoken it presumptuously. It will not come to pass."

Second Reading

1Cor 9:16-18, 2Cor 4:5, 7-12

A Reading from Paul's Letters to the Corinthians

When I proclaim the gospel, I cannot boast, since I am compelled to do it. Woe to me if I do not proclaim the gospel! If I preach voluntarily, I have a reward; if not voluntarily, I am simply discharging the trust committed to me. What then is my reward? Just this: that in preaching the gospel I may offer it free of charge, and so not make full use of my rights as a proclaimer of the gospel. We do not proclaim ourselves. We proclaim Jesus as the Christ and ourselves as servants for Jesus' sake.

We have this treasure in earthen vessels, so it is clear that the extraordinary power that fills us is from God. We are afflicted in every way, but not crushed; perplexed, but not driven to despair; persecuted, but not abandoned; struck

down, but not destroyed. We always carry in our bodies the death of Jesus, so that life may also be revealed in our bodies. We know that the One who raised Jesus the Christ will raise us also and will bring us all into the presence of God.

Homily Suzie Knapp

Prayers of the Faithful 01-28-2024 4th Sunday in the Orderly Course of Time and Suzie's Liturgy as Presider

Our response: Holy One, hear the prayers of our hearts.

All: Holy One, hear the prayers of our hearts.

That we might, through our sharing of this Table of Welcome, make Jesus's fame spread everywhere, throughout the whole region of San Diego ... we pray ...

All: Holy One, hear the prayers of our hearts.

For our dear sister Suzie, at this inauguration of her priestly ministry, that she might faithfully lead and serve God's people for the rest of her days, and that the Holy One and this community always be with her as her support and her inspiration ... we pray ...

All: Holy One, hear the prayers of our hearts.

That, with Paul, even when we are perplexed we will not be driven to despair, and when we are afflicted we will not be crushed ... we pray ...

All: Holy One, hear the prayers of our hearts.

That as the Body of Christ we order the unclean spirits of racism and violence to depart from our own lives and the lives of all those we encounter ... we pray ... *All: Holy One, hear the prayers of our hearts.*

The Earth contains the dust of countless generations of our ancestors, as well as the blood of Jesus and of our contemporaries killed in war. May this God-beloved Earth become for them and for us the garden of resurrection and new life ... we pray ...

All: Holy One, hear the prayers of our hearts.

In thanksgiving for God's self-revelation as the Life-Breath at the heart of the unfathomable diversity and immensity of the Cosmos ... we pray as Jesus said we should ...

All: Holy One, hear the prayers of our hearts.

[Invite the in-person community to sit, if they are standing.]

Now it is time to bring to God the personal prayers and intentions of our Spiritstrengthened ministering community of Alleluia and sorrow. We remember the universal needs of all living beings, surrounded by war, injustice, and violence, as well as by all-embracing Beauty and Love.

All who wish to share a prayer here in person, please come forward to the microphone. All who wish to share a prayer online, please raise your physical or digital hand and you will be called on in turn, or type your prayer in the chat and these will be read aloud.

We ask that your prayers be brief petitions, and in consideration of our diversity of perspectives, remembering the universal needs of all people.

[After each petition:]

All: Holy One, hear the prayers of our hearts.

[After all petitions have been spoken:]

We also lift up <u>all</u> those living with illness, injury, loss, and suffering, those who have gone home to the Holy One, and all the prayers here today that have remained unspoken, deep in the silence of our hearts...

(Short pause)

For these intentions and for all the prayers remaining in the chat and in our community prayer book ... we pray ...

All: Holy One, hear the prayers of our hearts.

Concluding Prayer: [Presider]

Tender and compassionate God, whose strength is made perfect in our weakness, help us to believe that you receive us as we are. More than that, help us to be carriers of the message of your love, like earthen vessels that carry treasures. Receive our prayers brought to you in hope, trust, and vulnerability today, we pray... **Amen.**

Everlasting God, your love is revealed to us in so many ways. Your care holds us close; your protection keeps us safe; your generosity teaches us to share with all humankind. As we break this bread and share this wine, we give thanks that your loving kindness is revealed in Jesus our brother, who reached out with compassion and taught with authority. May we find our nourishment in you, as we share these simple gifts with one another. We pray in Jesus' name.... **Amen.**

Eucharistic Prayer

Presider

Holy One, You call us into a vision of a Beloved Community, centered on the belief that racism, sexism, misogyny, bigotry, patriarchy, white privilege, Christian nationalism, and all prejudice will be replaced by an all-inclusive spirit of kinship. You call us to work for justice, to be mindful of all creation, to feed those who hunger at our door, to see no one left in need. We join with the angels and the saints from all peoples around the world to sing our song of praise:

Wholly, wholly, holy God. God of wonder God of awe. Heaven and earth are full of your glory! Hosanna in the highest. Blessed are all who come in the name of God. Hosanna, hosanna, hosanna in the highest! Hosanna, hosanna, hosanna in the highest!

Voice 1

God-in-all, how wonderful is your holy presence! We thank you for all throughout history who have affirmed Your loving presence and challenged Your people to give witness. Empower *us* to be in solidarity with those who live and love on the margins.

Pour out your Spirit on these gifts, O God. May this bread and wine become for us the body and blood of Jesus, enlivening us anew in our pursuit of a world where everyone can flourish and lead lives full of justice, love, and truth. We remember that...

All: ...on the night before Jesus died, while at supper with his friends, he took bread, said the blessing, broke the bread and gave it to them saying: "Take this, all of you and eat. This is my body. Do this in memory of me.

[Pause]

In the same way, Jesus took the cup filled with wine. He gave You thanks, and gave the cup to his friends, saying: "Take this all of you and drink. This is my life-blood, the Cup of Love. Do this in memory of me."

Presider

Let us proclaim the mystery of faith: (Recited)
Christ was birthed among us.
Christ was killed among us.
Christ rises again among us.

Voice 3

Giver of Sacred Worth, may the gift of our lives become, for others, Your church; the living presence of Christ. Change us, that others might have hope. Change us, that others might be valued. Change us, so that no one will have to stand before their oppressors alone.

Voice 4

Send Your Spirit sweeping through all human institutions. Transform our structures and traditions to create a world more responsive to Your vision of justice for all. Inspire religious and political leaders everywhere to embrace the challenges of these times, and to provide moral leadership where it is lacking.

Voice 5

You gather us around this table with Mary Magdalene, Jesus, and all the saints. Strengthen and comfort those treated with disrespect, who fear their lives will be discounted and discarded. Strengthen and comfort all who suffer.

Bless those who have gone before us into cosmic splendor. Bless us with wisdom, courage, and resolve as we re-commit ourselves to Your reign of justice, love, peace, and freedom. In Your presence, we give You glory with all creation and with Jesus through whom Your goodness flows:
