

Introduction & Welcome

Good evening. Whether you are joining us online or in person, welcome to Mary Magdalene the Apostle Catholic Community in San Diego, CA, on the land that the Kumeyaay people have tended for generations.

It is good to be together as we enter the new year.

My name is Vinka Valdivia, one of your lectors this evening. Nancy Corran is our homilist and in-person presider.

Second ReadingGalatians 4:4-7

A Reading from Paul's Letter to the Galatians

When the fullness of time had come, God revealed Godself in a human being, born of a woman, born under the Law in order to free those burdened under the law. In this way, *all* may now be adopted by God as God's own, including us.

Since we are God's own, God sent the spirit of Jesus into our hearts, the spirit who calls out to God, as to an intimate and loving parent, "Ima, Abba, Mother, Father!" So now, understand that you are no longer a slave to law, but you are God's own child; and if a child, then also an heir.

A Reading from the Gospel attributed to Luke.

Glory to you, O God.

Eight days after Mary had given birth, it was time to circumcise their child. He was called Jesus, the name given by the angel before he was conceived in the womb.

When the time came for purification according to the Law of Moses, Joseph and Mary brought Jesus to Jerusalem to present him to God. (It is written in the Law of God: "Every firstborn male shall be set apart and offered as holy to God.") So, they offered the appropriate sacrifice for Jesus according to what is stated in the Law: "a pair of turtle-doves or two young pigeons. Now, there was a man in Jerusalem whose name was Simeon. He was upright and devout, looking forward to the consolation of Israel. The Holy Spirit dwelt in him. It had been revealed to Simeon by the Holy Spirit that he would not see death before he had seen God's

Anointed. Guided by the Spirit, Simeon came into the Temple. When Mary and Joseph brought Jesus into the Temple, to do for him what was customary under the law, Simeon took Jesus in his arms and praised God, singing,

"Now let Your servant depart in peace, for Your word has been fulfilled.
My eyes have seen Your bearer of justice, made ready in the sight of all peoples: a revelation to the Gentiles, and glory to Your people."

The child's parents were amazed at what was being said about him. Then Simeon blessed them, and said to Mary, "This child is destined for the fall and the rise of many, destined to be a sign that will be opposed. The inner thoughts of many will be laid bare. And a sword will pierce your own heart too."

There was also a prophetess, Anna, the daughter of Phanuel, of the tribe of Asher. She was of a great age. After seven years of marriage, she lived as a widow to the age of eighty-four. She never left the Temple but worshipped night and day, fasting and praying. At the moment Simeon finished speaking, she joined those gathered and began to praise God. She spoke about the child to all who were anticipating the restoration of God's people.

When Mary and Joseph had completed everything required by the Law of God, they returned to Galilee, to their own town of Nazareth. The child grew and became strong, filled with wisdom. The favor of God was upon him.

(Short pause)


For these intentions and for all the prayers remaining in the chat and in our community prayer book ... we pray ...

May this meal be a source of strength and peace, reminding us that You are with us along the road ahead, reminding us that we are companions on the journey, we pray...**Amen.**

Eucharistic Prayer

Let us give thanks for God-with-us!

(Sung) Rise up, Shepherds, and follow. Rise up, Shepherds, and follow.

Presider

Cosmic Wisdom, we give You thanks. In the holy darkness of this night, Your light is born. You draw near to us; draw us into You. Release in us the joy of this Holy Night.

Voice 1

Help us to see Your cosmos anew. Embraced by Your nurturing darkness, we walk into the light of Your love as we join with all creation in unending praise: O holy night, the stars are brightly shining It is the night of the dear Christ-child's birth Long lay the world in pain and error pining 'Til Christ appeared and the soul felt its worth A thrill of hope, the weary world rejoices For yonder breaks a new and glorious morn' Fall on your knees, O hear the angels' voices O night divine, O night, O night divine.

Voice 2

Holy Love, You reveal yourself in Jesus' birth. In Jesus, we see the fullness of human possibility. In Jesus, hope is born.

Voice 3

We know this birth is a sign to us and to all the world of Your sacred presence in humanity and all creation, calling us to kinship and peace.

Voice 4

We rejoice in Jesus who taught us that we live in You, and that You are birthed in us and through us.

Presider

And so, Holy Love, we praise You through Jesus. We recognize Your Spirit alive and at work in this bread and wine, and in us. We open ourselves to Your Spirit who sanctifies and transforms these gifts to become You in us, the body and blood of Christ, as we now fulfill Your command of love. We remember that...

All: ...on the night before Jesus died, while at supper with his friends, he took bread, said the blessing, broke the bread and gave it to them saying: "Take this, all of you and eat. This is my body. Do this in memory of me."

[Pause]

In the same way, Jesus took the cup filled with wine. He gave You thanks, and gave the cup to his friends, saying: "Take this all of you and drink. This is my life-blood, the cup of love. Do this in memory of me."

Presider

Let us proclaim the mystery of faith: (Sung)

This, this is Christ the One whom shepherds guard and angels sing. Haste, Haste, we bring you laud, O babe, the child of Mary.

Voice 5

Remember Your people throughout the world and Your people gathered here. Remember all who seek You. Remember all who have died and are now in Your cosmic embrace. In Your goodness, may we experience Your life-giving presence in the company of all Your holy ones.

Presider

On this joyous night, we wonder at the mystery that, as You were born in Jesus, You are born in us. Together with Mary, Joseph, Mary Magdalene, all the saints, and Jesus through whom Your goodness flows, we proclaim Your glory.

Through Christ, with Christ, in Christ, In the unity of Sophia Spirit, One God of all that is, may glory and honor be yours.

Throughout the centuries, the prayer of Jesus, often known as the "Our Father," has been translated and rendered in many different ways. Please feel free to use the words and language most comfortable to you. We offer this recited contemporary version:

May the desire of Your heart for the world be done
in us, by us, and through us.
Give us the bread we need for each day.
Forgive us. Enable us to forgive others.
Keep us from all anxiety and fear.

which is Your glory, forever and ever. Amen.
