

[R] Glory to You, O God.

While Jesus was living in the Galilean hills, John, called "the Baptizer," was preaching in the desert of Judea saying, "Repent, for the kin-dom of heaven is at hand!" It was of John that the prophet Isaiah had spoken:

"A voice of one crying out in the desert, 'Prepare the way of God, make straight the paths.""

John wore clothing made of camel's hair and a leather belt around his waist. His food was locusts and wild honey. At that time, Jerusalem, all Judea, and the whole region around the Jordan were going out to John and were being baptized by him in the Jordan River as they acknowledged their offences.

When John saw many of the Pharisees and Sadducees coming to receive his baptism, he said to them, "You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the coming wrath? Produce good fruit as evidence of your repentance. Do not presume to say to yourselves, 'We have Abraham [and Sarah] as our ancestor.' For I tell you, God can raise up children to Abraham from these very stones. Even now the ax lies at the root of the trees. Therefore, every tree that does not bear good fruit will be cut down and thrown into the fire.

"I baptize you with water, for repentance, but after me comes one who is more powerful than I. I am not worthy to carry his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing fan is in his hand. He will clear the threshing floor and gather the wheat into the barn, but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire."

Prayers of the Faithful 12-07-2025

Second Sunday of Advent

[NOTE: The first two petitions today and on the remaining Sundays of Advent are taken from the "O antiphons" that have been sung in the evening prayer (vespers) of the Liturgy of the Hours in the last week before Christmas since at least the 8th century CE.]

" ... you shall judge the poor with justice, and defend the meek of the earth with equity." As we work in patient hope for the full realization of God's kin-dom, let us ask for all that we and all creation need.

Our response: Come, Holy One.

All: Come, Holy One.

O HaShem, Sacred Love of Israel and of all people, you appeared to Moses in the fire of the burning bush. Come and set <u>us</u> on fire with your Spirit ... we pray ...

All: Come, Holy One.

O Root of Jesse, sprung of Ruth, in your presence the leaders of nations fall silent, and peace takes hold. Come and deliver us; delay no longer ... we pray ...

All: Come, Holy One.

In memory eternal of our beloved MMACC co-founder Rod Stephens, that both he and we may forever dance in the loving embrace of Holy Mystery, Mother and Father of us all ... we pray ... *All: Come, Holy One.*

Scripture commands us to treat foreigners the same as citizens, and to love them equally, remembering that we, too, were once foreigners. Let us work to make our country welcoming to migrants, immigrants, asylum seekers, and refugees ... we pray ...

All: Come, Holy One.

For the courage to allow John the Baptizer's message of conversion to a kin-dom Way of life to take root and grow within us ... we pray ...

All: Come, Holy One.

The Earth contains the dust of countless generations of our ancestors, as well as the blood of Jesus and of our contemporaries killed in war. May this God-beloved Earth become for them and for us the garden of resurrection and new life ... we pray ...

All: Come, Holy One.

That we judge those who are poor with justice, and defend the meek of the earth with equity ... we pray as Jesus said we should ...

All: Come, Holy One.

Now it is time to bring to God the personal prayers and intentions of our hearts.

All who wish to share a prayer here in person, please come forward to the microphone. All who wish to share a prayer online, please raise your physical or digital hand and you will be called on in turn, or type your prayer in the chat and these will be read aloud.

We ask that your prayers be brief petitions, and in consideration of our diversity of perspectives, remember the universal needs of all people.

[After each petition:]

All: Come, Holy One.

[After all petitions have been spoken:]

We lift up <u>all</u> those living with illness, injury, loss, and suffering, those who have gone home in Holy Mystery, and all the prayers here today that have remained unspoken, deep in the silence of our hearts...

(Short pause)

For these intentions and for all the prayers remaining in the chat and in our community prayer book ... we pray ...

All: Come, Holy One.

All: ...on the night before Jesus died, while at supper with his friends, he took bread, said the blessing, broke the bread and gave it to them saying: "Take this, all of you and eat. This is my body. Do this in memory of me."

[Pause]

In the same way, Jesus took the cup filled with wine. He said the blessing, gave the cup to his friends, and said, "Take this all of you and drink. This is my life-blood, the cup of Love. Do this in memory of me."

Presider: Let us proclaim the mystery of faith: [sung] Schutte

Holy darkness, blessed night, Heaven's answer hidden from my sight. As we await you, O God of silence, we embrace your holy night

As we celebrate now, we remember *and* look for the birth of Jesus, Your Messiah, who loved us, even to death. His life and death are a parable, teaching us to pour out our lives for the life of all.
