Second Reading*1 Cor 1:1a, 2a, 10-19***A Reading from Paul's 1st Letter to the Corinthians**

Paul, called to be an apostle of Jesus the Christ by God...to the church of God in Corinth...
I appeal to you, beloved, in the name of Jesus the Christ. Live in harmony with one another. Have no divisions among you. Be united in one spirit and one purpose.

My dear kin in Christ, it has been reported to me from Chloe's household that there are quarrels among you. What I mean is this: One of you says, "I follow Paul"; another, "I follow Apollos"; another, "I follow Cephas"; still another "I follow Christ."

Has Christ been divided? Was Paul crucified for you? Were you baptized "in the name of Paul"? I thank God that I baptized none of you except Crispus and Gaius, so that no one can claim to have been baptized in my name. (Yes, I did also baptize the household of Stephanas. Beyond that, I do not remember whether I baptized anyone else.) For the Christ did not send me to baptize but to proclaim the good news. Even then, I do not preach with wisdom and eloquence, lest the cross of Christ be emptied of its power.

For the message of Christ's death on a cross is foolishness to those who insist on war and destruction as a means to victory. But to those who are being made whole, we know that God works most powerfully through human vulnerability. For it is written:

*"I will destroy the wisdom of the wise,
and the discernment of the discerning I will thwart."*

A Reading from the Gospel attributed to Matthew. ***Glory to you, O God.***

When Jesus heard that John had been arrested, he withdrew to Galilee. Jesus left Nazareth and went to stay in Capernaum by the sea, in the territory of Zebulun and Naphtali, so that what had been spoken through the prophet Isaiah might be fulfilled:

*"Land of Zebulun, land of Naphtali,
Way to the Sea, across the Jordan,
Galilee of the Gentiles:
A people suffering in the fog of ignorance
have seen a great light penetrating through.

From that time on, Jesus began to proclaim, "Repent for the Kingdom of Heaven has come near."

Jesus traveled throughout Galilee, teaching in their synagogues and proclaiming the good news of the coming Reign. He healed every disease and every sickness among the people. Jesus' fame spread throughout all Syria, and they brought him all those who were sick: those who were afflicted with various diseases, pains, demons, seizures, and paralysis. Jesus cured them all.

Great crowds followed Jesus from Galilee, the Decapolis, Jerusalem, Judea, and from beyond the Jordan.

Homily**Suzie Knapp****Prayers of the Faithful 01-25-26***3rd Sunday in the Order of Time*

“A people suffering in the fog of ignorance have seen a great light penetrating through ... a new day has dawned.” Knowing that we have been called by the Spirit as Jesus was, let us ask for all that we and all creation need.

Our response: The kin-dom of heaven has come near.

All: The kin-dom of heaven has come near.

That we, like Jesus, discern our call and work to embrace all who are afflicted with disease or sickness in body, in mind, in spirit ... we pray ...

All: The kin-dom of heaven has come near.

In thanksgiving for our dear sister Suzie, whose second anniversary of ordination to the priesthood occurs this week, that she may remain steadfast in her ministry, and that we remain a constant source of love and support for her ... we pray ...

All: The kin-dom of heaven has come near.

Scripture commands us to treat foreigners the same as citizens, and to love them equally, remembering that we, too, were once foreigners. Let us work to make our country welcoming to migrants, immigrants, asylum seekers, and refugees ... we pray ...

All: The kin-dom of heaven has come near.

That together we live out our commitment to do justice, to love kindness, and to walk humbly with God ... we pray ...

All: The kin-dom of heaven has come near.

The Earth contains the dust of countless generations of our ancestors, as well as the blood of Jesus and of our contemporaries killed in war. May this God-beloved Earth become for them and for us the garden of resurrection and new life ... we pray ...

All: The kin-dom of heaven has come near.

For those who do not believe that they can be channels of the Spirit, and for the times we have failed to live up to that realization ... we pray as Jesus said we should ...

All: The kin-dom of heaven has come near.

Now it is time to bring to God the personal prayers and intentions of our hearts.

All who wish to share a prayer here in person, please come forward to the microphone. All who wish to share a prayer online, please raise your physical or digital hand and you will be called on in turn, or type your prayer in the chat and these will be read aloud.

We ask that your prayers be brief petitions, and in consideration of our diversity of perspectives, remember the universal needs of all people.

[Pause]

After the meal, Jesus took a cup, gave thanks, and shared the cup with his friends, saying: Take this all of you and drink. This is the cup of my life-blood, the cup of love, a sign of the new and everlasting covenant. In prophetic solidarity, it is poured out for you and for all. Sustain one another in the power of sacred memory.

Presider:

Let us proclaim the mystery of our faith (sung): *Mass of Renewal, Stephan*

**We proclaim Your death O Jesus, and profess Your resurrection,
