Prayers of the Faithful 02-15-26

6th Sunday in the order of time

"Give to everyone who begs from you. Don't turn your back on someone who wants to borrow."
"I say to you, love your enemies. Pray for those who persecute you ..." As Scripture again challenges us deeply, let us ask for all that we and all creation need.

Our response: Holy Wisdom, open our hearts to your people.

All: Holy Wisdom, open our hearts to your people.

That Wisdom meet us like a mother, and feed us with the bread of understanding ... we pray ...

All: Holy Wisdom, open our hearts to your people.

That we join our prayers with our Muslim siblings, who begin their observance of Ramadan as we begin our observance of Lent ... we pray ...

All: Holy Wisdom, open our hearts to your people.

Scripture commands us to treat foreigners the same as citizens, and to love them equally, remembering that we, too, were once foreigners. Let us work to make our country welcoming to migrants, immigrants, asylum seekers, and refugees ... we pray ...

All: Holy Wisdom, open our hearts to your people.

That we give ourselves over to Wisdom, so that She might reveal the Divine within us and throughout the entire cosmos ... we pray ...

All: Holy Wisdom, open our hearts to your people.

The Earth contains the dust of countless generations of our ancestors, as well as the blood of Jesus, and of our contemporaries killed in war. May this God-beloved Earth become for them and for us the garden of resurrection and new life ... we pray ...

All: Holy Wisdom, open our hearts to your people.

For those who set themselves up as our enemies, and for those who persecute us ... we pray as Jesus said we should ...

All: Holy Wisdom, open our hearts to your people.

Now it is time to bring to God the personal prayers and intentions of our hearts.

All who wish to share a prayer here in person, please come forward to the microphone. All who wish to share a prayer online, please raise your physical or digital hand and you will be called on in turn, or type your prayer in the chat and these will be read aloud.

We ask that your prayers be brief petitions, and in consideration of our diversity of perspectives, remember the universal needs of all people.

[After each petition:]

All: Holy Wisdom, open our hearts to your people.

[After all petitions have been spoken:]

We lift up all those living with illness, injury, loss, and suffering, those who have gone home in Holy Mystery, and all the prayers here today that have remained unspoken, deep in the silence of our hearts...

(Short pause)

For these intentions and for all the prayers remaining in the chat and in our community prayer book ... we pray ...

All: Holy Wisdom, open our hearts to your people.

Closing Presider's Prayer: *Holy Love, we open our hearts to all peoples, and we have opened our hearts to You in prayer. Receive our prayers into Your open heart. May they, like the angels, fly to be agents of healing in our world. May they quicken us to be agents of healing in our world, we pray... Amen.*

Presider:

We invoke Your Spirit upon these gifts of grain and vine, that they may become the body and blood of Jesus in us, to nurture in us the discerning gifts of wisdom, life, and truth.

ALL: The night before Jesus died, he gathered around the table of shared wisdom with his disciples. Jesus took bread; blessed You, God of all good gifts; broke the bread and gave it to the disciples, saying: Take this all of you and eat. This is my body which is for you.

[Pause]

After the meal, Jesus took a cup, gave thanks, and shared the cup with his friends, saying: Take this all of you and drink. This is the cup of my life-blood, the cup of love, a sign of the new and everlasting covenant. In prophetic solidarity, it is poured out for you and for all. Sustain one another in the power of sacred memory.

Presider: Let us proclaim the mystery of our faith (*sung*): *Mass of Renewal, Stephan*
***We proclaim Your death O Jesus, and profess Your resurrection,
until You come again.***

Voice 4: As we celebrate this sacred meal, we remember the blessings of ages past, and we look forward in hope, knowing that You, Holy Love, will continue to empower us in our earthly mission.

Presider: In union with all peoples living and dead, we unite our longings and prayers, asking for wisdom and courage:

Voice 5: to discern Your Voice in the circumstances of our daily lives;

Voice 6: to act justly in confronting the desecration of Earth and its peoples, their pain and their suffering;

Voice 7: to take risks to be creative and proactive on behalf of those who are poor and marginalized;

Voice 8: and to love all people, beyond all our labels, with generosity of heart.

Presider: As our world unfolds amid pain and beauty, inspire us to attend to new things Sophia Spirit makes possible. Remind us that we are co-creators in the wise and wonderful work of creation, and our future.
