Youth Accounts:

- Youth accounts are different than service hours.
- Starting in sixth grade, youth may begin adding funds to a youth account.
- Youth accounts are available for all youth at OSLC. Unlike servant hours, youth accounts are designed to help youth earn funds for OSLC or LCMS (Lutheran Church Missouri Synod) youth trips and events.
- Youth are able to fund their accounts by working at various fundraising events throughout the year. If you work an approved event, you will automatically have an account set up for you. ***Some fundraising events are not included because they fund entire group expenses such as travel and hotel.***
- Money in youth accounts can be used toward OSLC and LCMS youth trips and activities like National Youth Gathering, Summer Mission Trips, the annual skip trip, or to fund camps at Shepherd's Hill at the Crossroads.
- The money carries over year-to-year (if it is not used in the year it was earned). If you have funds left in your youth account when you graduate, they can be rolled into a siblings account. You can NOT cash them out for cash. So be sure to use them! There are many opportunities available every year.
