

**PHBC COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIP  
GOVERNING PRINCIPLES**

1. The Deacons of the Church will receive applications and select the scholarship recipient/recipients for the Spring and Fall Semesters of each year.
2. Scholarships will be awarded in July for the Fall Semester and in December for the Spring Semester of that particular year.
3. Students who apply for the scholarships must meet the following qualifications:
  - a. Be a member of Pleasant Hill Baptist Church.
  - b. Regular attendance at Pleasant Hill Baptist Church for at least six months prior to date applying for a scholarship. If applicable, regular attendance at Pleasant Hill and a Southern Baptist Church in University town acceptable. (Regular attendance defined as attending a minimum of two services per month.)
  - c. Be enrolled as a full time undergraduate student in an accredited Community College, College or University.
  - d. Be enrolled as a full or part time graduate student in an accredited College, University, or Graduate School.
  - e. Attend Church on a regular basis at Pleasant Hill Baptist Church during term of scholarship. If applicable, attendance at a Southern Baptist Church in University town may be substituted for attendance requirement. (Regular basis defined as attending a minimum of two services per month.)
4. The following criteria will be used in awarding the scholarships:
  - a. Personal character and Christian commitment demonstrated by the applicant.
  - b. When there are several qualified applicants and limited scholarship funds, preference should be given to those who are not receiving or have not received prior educational assistance from the Church and those students who demonstrate financial need.
5. The following procedure shall be used in amending or revising these Governing Principles:
  - a. Other criteria may be developed by the Deacons subject to the approval of the Pleasant Hill Baptist Church in a quarterly or special called business meeting.
  - b. The above Governing Principles may be amended upon recommendation of the Deacons and upon approval by the Church in a quarterly or special called business meeting.
