



## Growth Groups: Week 4 (10/8-12)

**Confession:** What do you need to confess? (Here are some questions to help you examine ways you might not be believing the Gospel).

- Who or what do you fear the most?
- Whose approval are you seeking?

**Learning:** What are you learning?

- What are you reading in the Bible? What did you learn about God? What did you learn about the Gospel?
- How is consistency?

**Accountability:** How can your Growth Group hold you accountable this week?

- **Who have you shared the Gospel with this week?**
- This ties in with the confession questions. This is a practical way to walk together to identify sin and pursue sanctification together.
- How can your Growth Group help point each other to the Gospel daily? Come up with practical ways to follow through.

**Prayer & Praise:** How can we pray for you? What are you praising God for?

**Scripture Memory: 2 Corinthians 5:17-20**, “Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old has passed away; behold, the new has come. All this is from God, who through Christ reconciled us to himself and gave us the ministry of reconciliation; that is, in Christ God was reconciling the world to himself, not counting their trespasses against them, and entrusting to us the message of reconciliation. Therefore, we are ambassadors for Christ, God making his appeal through us. We implore you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God.”

## Gospel Appointments

### Discussion

We do not have Crave this week, instead we will have our Connect Group Fellowships. In your Growth Groups, we would like for you to discuss the following things:

- Who are people in your life that are not followers of Jesus? Take time to write out names and discuss how you know them.
  - If you aren't able to name anyone, why do you think that is?
  - What needs to happen so that you can diversify the people you are around? We need to be looking for opportunities to build relationships with people on campus. Statistically, 95% of the students at UNT are not pursuing a relationships with Jesus (that's over 35,000 students), so realistically, you are around non-believers all the time.
- Do these people know that you are a Christian? Have you shared the Gospel with them?
  - If not, what would need to happen so that you could share the Gospel with them? (We call this Gospel Appointments – planning an intentional time to share the Gospel with someone)
- Was it hard for you to share the Gospel with them? If so, why?
- Who are some friends of your on campus that you could invite to join your Connect Group Fellowship this week?
- Spend time praying over the names on your lists.
- Discuss what your “Gospel Appointment” plan is and how you can hold each other accountable to share the Gospel with these people.
