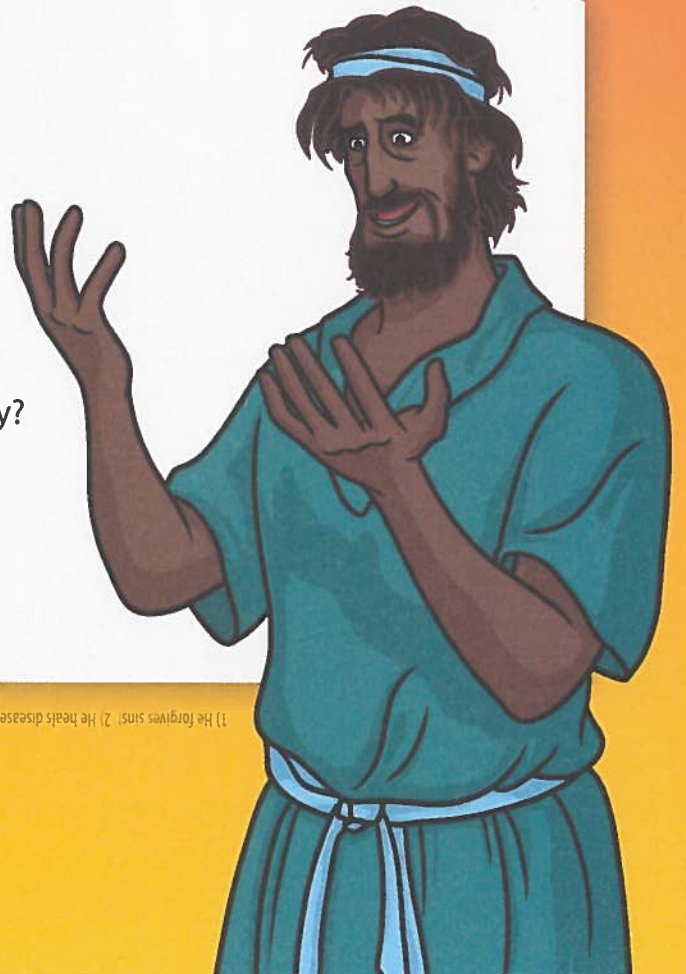

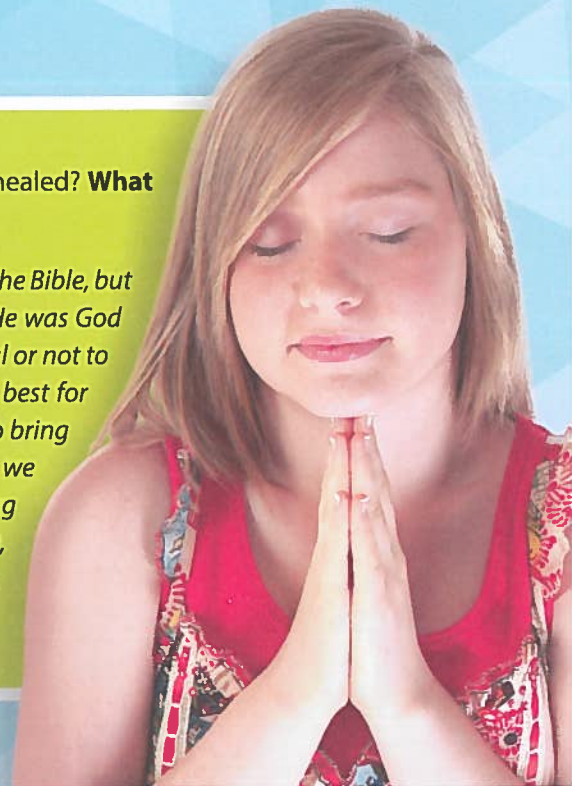

## LIVE the Word

What if your friend said that if you have enough faith you could be healed? **What could you say?**

*I've heard that, too. But it isn't biblical! Jesus healed a lot of people in the Bible, but it wasn't to measure a person's faith. Jesus healed people to show He was God and to glorify the Father. That is still the case. God can choose to heal or not to heal—and He can get glory in either situation. God knows what is best for us. And what He brings into our lives is what is best. God promises to bring comfort to His children when they are suffering. And the comfort we receive from God can help us to comfort others who are also suffering in some way. Don't get me wrong. We can certainly pray for healing, and God wants us to do that. But the results are always up to God. And whatever the results, He wants us to glorify Him through it.*



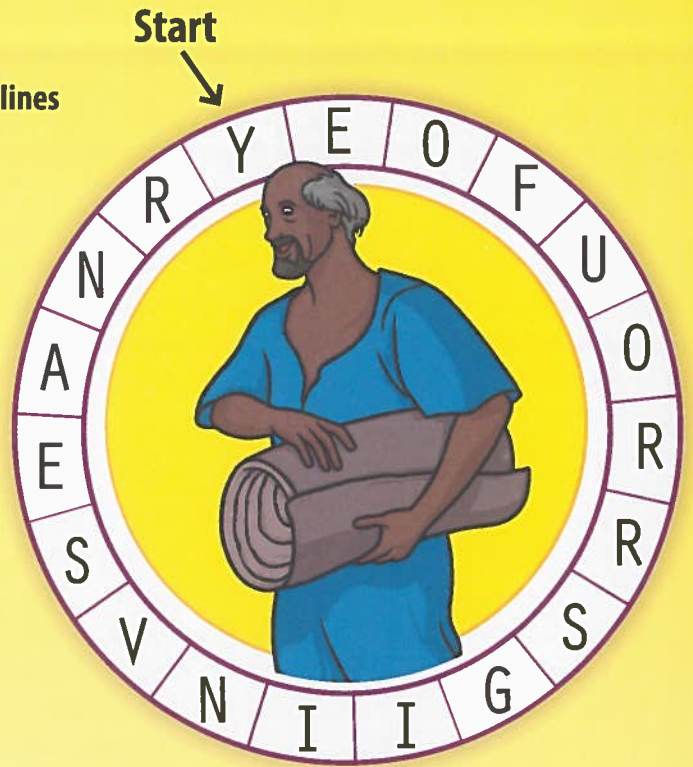

## HomeWord

For Parents

**J**esus came to do His Father's will. Part of that mission was to present who He was and who had sent Him. The miracles He performed confirmed these things. Jesus truly was God in the flesh, the Creator, the Messiah—the Son of God.

A healing miracle of Jesus is recorded in John 9. It concerned a man who had been blind from birth. The disciples wondered if the man or his parents had sinned. Jesus replied, "Neither this man nor his parents sinned, but that the works of God should be revealed in him" (John 9:3). This man's blindness was not a result of personal sin, but rather that Jesus might heal his blindness, and thus display the glory of God and His own deity.

Jesus was not concerned primarily with physical healing. He came to do His Father's will. And that included providing eternal life to sinners (John 5:24). The account of Jesus healing the paralytic is an example of His ability and desire to heal physically and spiritually (Mark 2:1–12.) Jesus told the paralytic, "Son, your sins are forgiven you."

These words spoke directly to the man's more serious problem—the sin in his heart. The scribes immediately accused Jesus of blasphemy because only God can forgive sins (Mark 2:6–7). They were right. But because Jesus is God, He can forgive sins.

Jesus also had the power to heal this man physically. He told the man to rise, take his bed, and go home (Mark 2:11). This account shows that Jesus, as God, not only has power to heal, but also to forgive sins and grant eternal life to all who believe and trust in Him—in His life, death, and Resurrection!

## OutWord

For Family Discussion

What if a friend asks you why we don't see miracles like they used to in Bible times? **What could you say?**

*In the Old Testament God used miracles to show people He was the one true God. He parted the Red Sea. He sent manna from heaven. He caused a donkey to talk! And in the New Testament Jesus did miracles so people would know He was God. He walked on water, healed the sick, and rose from the dead. God still does miracles today. He is still healing people from disease when it is His will. He is changing hearts to repent of sin and seek after Him. He still forgives sins and gives hope of eternal life to all who believe in Him. That is the greatest miracle of all time—that God would step into history as the man Jesus, and offer salvation to sinful men. He died, was buried, and rose again! That's the miracle we all need to believe in.*
