# The Congregation at Prayer

A Guide for Daily Meditation and Prayer For the Week of the Third Last Sunday of the Church Year November 9, 2025 through November 15, 2025

**Notes on the Weekday Readings—Monday:** The announcement to Abraham was followed by a visit of God Himself to Abraham's household. By this we are to be reminded that our Lord does not pass by His servants, but comes to them. The Blessed Trinity has not forgotten the promise to send the Savior who through His suffering, death, and resurrection has accomplished what is too hard for men. At the appointed time, God sent forth His Son, born of woman, to redeem us that we might have true joy and laughter. Tuesday: God invites us to pray and promises to hear us. He also desires to bless all nations and save them from judgment. Abraham came to God on the basis of the grace by which he was called. The prayer of faith always appeals to that grace, for there is no merit in the sinner. Abraham interceded just as Christ intercedes for us, that we might be spared from the destruction of the wicked world in time, and on the Day of Judgment. We likewise pray God to call others out of the wicked world through the preaching of the Gospel. Wednesday: The destruction of Sodom and Gomorrah is a picture of the events of Judgment Day. In the midst of destruction, the grace of God was at work as He delivered Lot from the destruction. We are taught here not only the reality of hell, but also the comfort that God will rescue from eternal fire all who believe in His Son. Thursday: Abraham did not perfectly or always trust the promise of God. And yet God calls him a prophet. It is God's promise that always drives His actions, not the worthiness or strength of faith of His people. This is what sustains faith in all of God's people. Great prophets and preachers are included in this. Though they are no worthier than Abraham, yet they are appointed by God as bearers of His promise to the nations of the earth and by which they themselves live, Friday: God once more speaks the promise for Isaac, and reassures Abraham that Ishmael would prosper. In the visit of the Angel of God to Hagar there is a foreshadowing of the New Testament church when the nations of the earth will be gathered together through the spring of living water under the tree of the cross. In Jesus there is resurrection from certain death as God hears our cries. Those once children of bondage will be made free.

## The Order of Meditation and Prayer

Pray out loud as much as you are able, and as your family size and ages dictate.

Theme of the Week: The Age Before the End

#### Invocation

#### Ten Commandments

You shall have no other gods.

Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy.

Honor your father and your mother.

You shall not murder.

You shall not commit adultery.

You shall not steal.

You shall not misuse the name of the Lord your God. You shall not give false testimony against your neighbor.

You shall not covet your neighbor's house.

You shall not covet your neighbor's wife, or his manservant or maidservant, his ox or donkey, or anything that belongs to your neighbor.

What does God say about all these commandments?

He says: "I, the Lord your God, am a jealous God, punishing the children for the sin of the fathers to the third and fourth generation of those who hate Me, but showing love to a thousand generations of those who love Me and keep My commandments."

### Apostles' Creed

I believe in God the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth. And in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried. He descended into hell. The third day He rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God, the Father Almighty. From thence He will come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Christian church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life \* everlasting. Amen.
