

Theme of Today's Liturgy

Our prayer in today's Collect provides a summary of the themes of today's Divine Service: God is "the strength of all who put their trust in" Him. We have confidence that He will not cast us off forever nor forget us in our affliction (*Introit*). By His Word preached and publicly read, our Lord plants the seed of His saving Word in our hearts, and so by faith we receive Christ (*Gospel*).

But the ones on the rock are those who, when they hear, receive the word with joy; and these have no root, who believe for a while and in time of temptation fall away. Now the ones that fell among thorns are those who, when they have heard, go out and are choked with cares, riches, and pleasures of life, and bring no fruit to maturity. But the ones that fell on the good ground are those who, having heard the word with a noble and good heart, keep it and bear fruit with patience.”





The “Gesima” Season

The Church Year and liturgy prepare us for Easter in three distinct periods. The first is *Gesimatide* or Pre-Lent. The Latin names for these three Sundays are numeric, serving as a countdown to Easter. These three Sundays prepare us for the spiritual journey of Lent by focusing our attention on the grace of God:

Septuagesima (“70 days”): Grace is undeserved. The undeserved goodness of God is seen in the parable of the workers (Matthew 20:1–16). All the laborers receive the reward not because of their own labor or merit, but because of the goodness of the landowner. Christ has borne the heat and burden of the day for us so that we might have His grace for free.

Sexagesima (“60 days”): Grace is received through the Word of God. The parable of the sower (Luke 8:4–15) shows how God’s Word is received. It transforms bad soil into good and noble hearts. We pray that this would happen to and for us.

Quinquagesima (meaning “about 50 days”): Grace is only understood by faith. On the Sunday before Ash Wednesday, we hear Jesus predict His passion, death, and resurrection. We also hear that the disciples did not understand this. We pray that God would be gracious and patient with us and grant faith and understanding to us despite our many sins.

The liturgy of the three Sundays in Gesimatide eases us into the more somber season of Lent. The “Alleluias” are dropped, but we continue to sing the *Gloria in Excelsis*. The color is no longer the joyful white, nor is it yet the penitential violet, but is rather green. We also retain the festive custom of singing the liturgy.
