CALL TO CONFESSION


PRAYER OF CONFESSION

Recommendations*

(*Always consult your health care provider)

Colonoscopy

- ❖ Ages 45-75: Every 10 years for those at average risk
- Ages 76-85: Consult your health care provider

Mammogram

❖ Ages 40-74: Every other year for those at average risk

Skin cancer screening

- Everyone: monthly self-exam
- Those at high risk: health care provider exam every year
- Those at average risk: health care provider exam every other year
- ❖ What to look for:
 - A: Asymmetry (shape of one half does not match other half)
 - B: Border (edges are ragged, notched, or blurred)
 - C: Color (uneven color)
 - **D**: **D**iameter (increase in size)
 - E: Evolving (changes over weeks or months)

Resources

Carecalendar.org: Free website to organize meals and other help for families during a time of illness, recovery or any life-changing event (not just a cancer diagnosis).

Caringbridge.org: Nonprofit health platform offering tools to share and document a health journey (again, <u>not</u> just for cancer), eliminating the need for busy patients and caregivers to notify multiple contacts about updates in care and health status.

Cancersupportcommunity.org: Nonprofit offering a wide variety of professionally led programs including support groups, fitness classes, and educational workshops free of charge to anyone affected by a cancer diagnosis, including children, teens, families, and caregivers. One clubhouse in the DFW area (Dallas).
