

BREAKING OF THE BREAD AND POURING OF THE WINE

*Communion of the People: **For in-person
worshippers:** The outer ring is wine (red). All the
inner rings are white grape juice (gluten free).
Inside the pouch marked "Gluten Free" are gluten
free crackers.*

***For remote worshippers:** Use your own cup and
bread.*

*Take and eat the bread as it is passed, symbolizing
your personal need for God's mercy. Hold the cup
until all have received it, and then drink together,
symbolizing our unity in the body of Christ.*

Katie and her husband Phil Cummings, a retired attorney, live in Irving. Their daughter Leigh, also an attorney, and grand-dog Arlo, live in Houston.

1. **Who?** Anyone and everyone.
 2. **What?** Dedicated time of prayer
 3. **Where?** In the church sanctuary, in your home or another place of your choice
 4. **When?** World Day of Prayer, Friday March 6, sign up to cover a 15 minute time slot by using the QR code below or paper schedule sheet on table in Narthex
 5. **Why?** Follow the model of Jesus who would withdraw to a quiet place to pray as he ministered to the multitudes. May we seek discernment for ways to minister in our community.
 6. **How?** Use the prayer model from website <http://worlddayofprayer.net/program.html>, use The Lord's Prayer, use our church's prayer list, use your own words and concerns
