Communion

Christ invites us to his table. We welcome all who wish to receive the Lord's Supper. As Lutherans, we believe in the real presence of Christ in, with, and under the bread and wine; for those with other understandings, we trust that God's grace is bigger than our differences. Those who have not received communion are invited to come forward to receive a blessing.

At the ushers' direction, come forward using the center aisle. A piece of bread will be placed into your open hand. You may instinct (dip) it into the large chalice of wine or the small chalice of grape juice. Return to your seat using the side aisle.

Instead of the bread and wine, you may pick up one of the sealed wafer/grape juice packets or a sealed gluten free wafer and hear the words of promise before returning to your seat to open it.
