- Welcome! We are happy to have you join us today. If you would like more information about St. Andrew, please email <u>office@saintandrew-ic.org</u> or visit <u>https://bit.ly/sapc-connection</u>.
- Our worship services begin **in-person and online at 9:30 a.m. on Sunday mornings**, followed by Sunday School and Adult Christian Education offerings from September to April and a variety of After Worship activities from May to August. The service usually begins with Welcome & Announcements a few minutes before 9:30 a.m.
- All ages are welcome in our worship services. Worship materials for all ages are available in The Maker's Toolbox outside the north entrance to the Sanctuary.
- Nursery care (up to age 2) is provided in the Lower Level throughout the morning. Programming for children (through Kindergarten age) begins in the Lower Level after the Time for Young Disciples on most Sundays and after the Sharing of Christ's Peace and Compassion on Communion Sundays.
- Large print hymnals, bibles, and bulletins also are available outside the Sanctuary doors.
- A T-Coil hearing assist loop is also available for those with this feature on their hearing aids.
- Prayer Requests may be written on a blue Prayer Request Card and placed in the offering plates as they are passed or offered online at .
- Unless otherwise designated, gifts given to the weekly offering—either in the offering plates or through our
  website—support the annual church budget, including staff salaries, utilities, mission outreach, and all aspects of

# Alleluia! Sing to Jesus

For the next few weeks, the **Music Response** to the **Prayer of Confession and Promise of Ever-Present Grace** will be a portion of the the hymn, "**Lift Every Voice and Sing**," which is also known as "The Black National Anthem."

James Weldon Johnson wrote the text in 1900, and his brother John Rosamond Johnson composed the music. It was first performed by 500 schoolchildren at the segregated Stanton School in Jacksonville, Florida, to celebrate Abraham Lincoln's birthday.

As a response to our collective confession, the music can also remind us that sometimes our faith is shaped in dark times and that in Jesus, we can have hope in a new day through Jesus' forgiveness.

We'll sing more of the hymn in worship on June 18, the Sunday closest to the Juneteenth holiday.




"The Harp," by Augusta Savage (1892-1962), was inspired by James Weldon Johnson's "Lift Every Voice and Sing."
