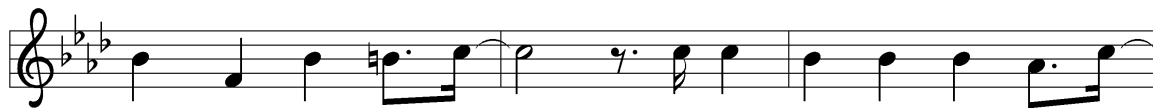

An Invitation from Act Justly

St. Andrew's church office will be closed on Monday (Jan. 19), and **Act Justly** invites members of the congregation to honor **Martin Luther King Jr. Day** by joining our wider community for a full day of service, across the Iowa City-Coralville area.

The day begins with a **MLK Day of Service** from **9:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m.** at the Mercer Park Aquatic Center, in collaboration with the Black Voices Project. This family-friendly gathering includes volunteer opportunities with local organizations, music, presentations, and a shared community lunch. An optional community meetup and march begin earlier at **8:45 a.m.** at Eastdale Plaza.

From **10 a.m. to 2 p.m.**, community members may gather at the Iowa City Senior Center for a **Food Drive & Art Workshop**, featuring a potluck meal and a collaborative mural. This event is part of **Black Future Fest**, a month-long celebration of Afrofuturistic art and imagination.

At **2 p.m.**, Act Justly especially encourages St. Andrew members to attend the annual MLK celebration at Bethel African Methodist Episcopal Church. This year's program, *"What Would Dr. King Say?"*, includes music, poetry, and a keynote address by **Tiffini Stevenson Earl**, followed by a reception.

The day concludes at the Coralville Public Library with a **Volunteer Fair** (4:30–6:30 p.m.) and a **community reading of Dr. King's "I Have a Dream" speech** (5:30–6:00 p.m.).

Act Justly hopes you will join us as we honor Dr. King through presence, service, and faithful action.

A Note on Today's Music Selections

In today's Scripture, we hear a clear movement from despair toward joy—a trajectory that is echoed in the music we sing together.

Our gathering hymn, "Jesus Is a Rock," began as a traditional spiritual and, over time, took on rhythmic features associated with contemporary gospel styles. Its message is one of steadiness and trust, yet the minor key and slightly slower tempo carry a hint of heaviness, reflecting a faith that holds fast even while weighed down by sorrow.

By contrast, our closing hymn, "I'm So Glad," is exuberant and full of joy, mirroring the final declaration of Jonah 2: "Deliverance belongs to the Eternal alone." The journey from lament to praise is not rushed—but it is real.

A second lens shaping today's music is both Martin Luther King Jr. Weekend and the recent death of acclaimed composer Richard Smallwood, who died on December 30, 2025. Smallwood was an internationally respected composer and choral director, best known for his powerful gospel works. His anthem "Total Praise," sung today by the Logos Choir, has become a modern classic—offering words of trust that resonate deeply in times of uncertainty and hope alike.

While it is fitting to lift up music by Black composers during this weekend and during Black History Month, my hope is that such music is part of St. Andrew's regular musical life throughout the year—forming, sustaining, and enriching our worship in every season.
