### **Bulletin Cover**

• The Eucharist Door to the Glory Façade of the Basilica de la Sagrada Familia in Barcelona, Spain. Installed in 2008 and sculpted by Josep Maria Subirachs, the door is 15 feet tall and 16 feet wide. The center features the full Lord's Prayer in Catalan, with the rest of the door being filled with the phrase "Give us this day our daily bread" in 50 different languages. ## Questions for Reflection

- Today's Gospel reading includes a version of the Lord's Prayer from Luke that differs slightly from Matthew's version, which we say after the Prayers of the People. How do these versions speak to you? How does the humility and brevity of Luke's compare with the ornate engraved version on the Bulletin Cover?
- The Psalmist says "unfailing love and truth have met," and "righteousness and peace have kissed." What might that look like in our community? In our nation? In our congregation?
- What gardening metaphors come to mind when the Psalmist says "truth springs from the earth" and "the Eternal plants goodness in the land"? How can truth and goodness be cultivated in our lives? How can we live out those metaphors through garden ministries like St. Andrew's Lettuce Feed Others?



#### Dear St. Andrew Family,

We have so much to celebrate.

Years ago, God placed a bold vision before us. Through five faithful capital campaigns, we've built a church that's become home to worship, learning, and outreach—welcoming new disciples and transforming lives. Our original \$5.8 million mortgage is now just \$1.8 million. With God's help, and your



generosity, we believe we can pay it off before our balloon payment and interest adjustment hit in 2027.

Our 2022–25 campaign, *Rooted in Faith* | *Growing to Serve*, gave us strong roots. Now, our final campaign—*Finish the Race* | *Owe Nothing But Love* (2025–28)—invites us to complete the journey.

Already, we've received pledges totaling \$1.15 million—64% of our goal. Every gift helps. Once the debt is retired, every mortgage dollar can be released for student ministry, justice work, mission, and future ministry. If gifts exceed our goal, any surplus will be invested in long-term building care and next-generation needs.
