# Questions for Reflection

- Today's Psalm describes how God rescues those in deep trouble, guiding them onto the right path. How does the cover image, Riders of Lost Paths No. 92 by Imren lyem, capture the desperation—and the hope—of people longing for deliverance?
- Psalm 107 opens with a call to "Erupt with thanks to the Eternal." In what ways
  do today's hymns give voice to our gratitude? Are there particular lines or
  melodies that feel like an eruption of thanks?
- "He satisfies the thirsty and fills the hungry with good things," says verse 9.
   How does that promise echo in the line from today's middle hymn: "You shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceeds from the mouth of God"?





# Dear St. Andrew Family,

We have so much to celebrate.

Years ago, God placed a bold vision before us. Through five faithful capital campaigns, we've built a church that's become home to worship, learning, and outreachwelcoming new disciples and transforming lives. Our original \$5.8 million mortgage is now just \$1.8 million. With God's help, and your generosity, we believe we can pay it off before our balloon payment and interest adjustment hit in 2027.

Already, we've received pledges totaling \$1.15 million—64% of our goal. Every gift helps. Once the debt is retired, every mortgage dollar can be released for student ministry, justice work, mission, and future ministry. If gifts exceed our goal, any surplus will be invested in long-term building care and next-generation needs.
