### Questions for Reflection

- God's radiance, as described in Psalm 50, is not always comforting: "He will
  not enter on a whisper. A fire will devour the earth before Him; the wind will
  storm wildly about Him." How are these unsettling images reflected in today's
  bulletin cover? How do we hold them alongside our belief in a God of EverPresent Grace?
- Psalm 50 challenges hollow rituals—sacrifices offered without gratitude or sincerity. In your own spiritual life, are there practices that have become more performative than prayerful? What might it mean for you to "offer a sacrifice of thanksgiving" this week?
- Jesus teaches that "where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." What
  do your priorities—your calendar, your spending, your focus—reveal about the
  orientation of your heart? What would you hope they reveal instead?

Encourage us to stay engaged and committed to meaningful dialogues filled with grace.



# 13 The Mighty God with Power Speaks



This paraphrase, set to a familiar English folk melody, focuses on the opening narrative section of Psalm 50 without attempting to summarize God's speeches in the latter portion of the psalm. Both parts bear witness to God's sovereignty, God's justice, and God's providence.

It seems odd now to think of singing this text to ADESTE FIDELES, but mainline churches did so well into the 20th century because of a cultural bias against shape note music. The vigor of the present tune seems especially right for the final line's reference to Hebrews 13:5.
