Questions for Reflection

- The hymn "Great Is Thy Faithfulness" proclaims God's unchanging mercy "morning by morning," yet today's gospel urges us to "interpret the urgency of this present moment." How do we stay steady in trust while also answering God's urgent calls for change?
- Psalm 80 pleads for God's protection, especially in its final verse: "Turn the light of Your face upon us so that we will be rescued from this sea of darkness." How does that plea connect with the hymn line, "In days of darkness give us faith and confidence in you so we may walk with trust and hope to serve no one but you"?
- Psalm 80 also reminds us we are grafted from elsewhere and nurtured where planted. The hymn "Guide Me, O Thou Great Jehovah" traces a pilgrim's journey to safe arrival. How have you been nurtured at St. Andrew—and how might you help newcomers find that same welcome and care?




