Bulletin Cover & Sermon Series

- Today's cover features *Waste Not Want Not*, a bread plate designed around 1850 by English architect and designer Augustus Welby Northmore Pugin. Around its edge, the plate offers a simple reminder: what we place on our tables is not something to take for granted, or to waste. That fits today's prayer: "Give us this day our daily bread." In Exodus, manna arrives each morning, enough for the day but not something to hoard. In John, a few loaves and fish become enough to feed a crowd. Both stories turn our attention from "What do I have?" toward "Is there enough for all of us?"

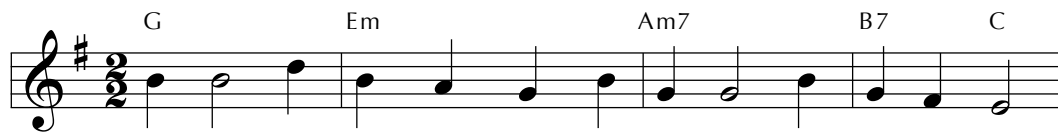

Evicting the American Dream

At 2:30 p.m. Sunday Oct. 11, St. Andrew's Act Justly will screen the documentary **Evicting the American Dream** in the Sanctuary. The film is free, and when it ends, the conversation will begin.

Evicting the American Dream tells the stories of children and families confronting eviction and homelessness, but it also asks viewers to look beyond individual stories to the systems surrounding them.

An eviction filing can follow a family long after they leave a home. Renters facing eviction often lack legal representation. Redlining and other discriminatory housing practices have consequences that stretch across generations.

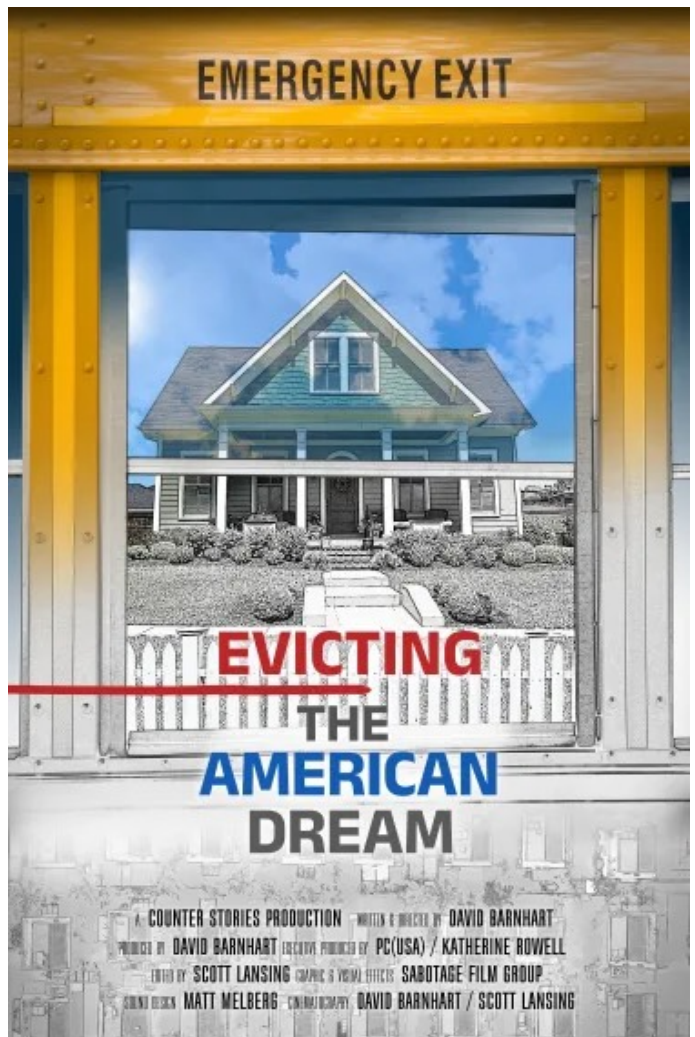
As director David Barnhart puts it: "Why do we continue to develop and support systems in this country that do not prioritize our children?"

The documentary comes from Counter Stories Productions, the Story Ministry of **Presbyterian Disaster Assistance**, and was intentionally created as a starting point for local discussions. The Rev. Denise Anderson of the PC(USA)'s Compassion, Peace & Justice ministries calls it an example of "listening to voices long silenced."

After the credits roll, we'll bring that conversation home. Act Justly is inviting people whose work and relationships bring them close to homelessness and housing insecurity in our community to help us understand what these issues look like here.

And we hope you'll be part of the conversation, too. Come to listen, ask questions and learn alongside neighbors about the challenges people face in finding and keeping a safe, stable place to live.

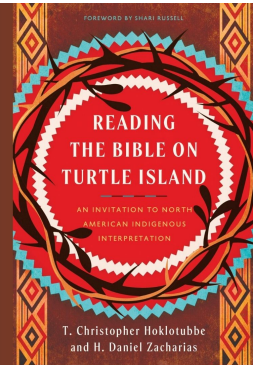
