Almost There & Already Looking Ahead

Seventeen years. Five campaigns. Countless stories of generosity. And now, less than \$200,000 stands between us and our \$1.8 million goal of being debt-free.

Today we are gathering the final pledges for the Finish the Race | Owe Nothing But Love campaign. If you haven't yet had the chance, we invite you to finalize what you feel called to give. Every response helps us take this last step together with clarity and confidence.

Being this close changes how we see the future. For years we've been focused on paying down the mortgage, but now conversations are shifting to what comes next. One example: tucked behind the lower-level bathrooms are framed-in but unfinished shower stalls, a vision planted when the building was first designed. At the time, planners imagined St. Andrew welcoming mission teams or hosting weeks of service with our own students. But as budgets tightened, the project was set aside, hidden behind temporary walls.

With the finish line in sight, we have a chance to bring that vision to life. Completing the showers would be a tangible reminder that our building is built for mission. It would prepare us to host a week of service this fall, extend our hospitality, and embody once more that St. Andrew is ready to welcome.

The work of retiring debt is about more than numbers. It is about freeing our imagination and our resources for ministry.
