The FUMC Rent Security Deposit Assistance Program

In 2020, FUMC spent \$34,070 helping 118 households move into affordable, safe and secure homes.

As you can guess, the pandemic and the quarantine made many bad situations worse for our neighbors. Here are but a few of the stories behind the numbers.

A man living on disability income struggled with both the loss of his childhood home and the death of his mother and stepfather from covid. He had saved \$900 toward the \$1550 needed for the security deposit. RSDAP grant helped him to move into his own Section 8 subsidized apartment, "...the only bright thing in my life right now."

Last September a home health aide and her child moved into a subsidized apartment. Recently management sent her a pay-or-quit notice stating she still owed \$100 on her security deposit. By then she had no funds and was unable to return to work, having caught Covid. Her unemployment benefits ended as well.

A disabled woman was in the hospital receiving cancer treatment. Meanwhile, her landlady sold the house she was renting, forcing the woman to move right away. Fairlington UMC collaborated with Bridges for Independence to help with housing applications and security deposit assistance.

A phlebotomist from Missouri was in Alexandria working on contract, living in a residence hotel and sending money home for live-in child care. Her husband was in a long-term nursing facility back home and was unable to care for the children. All of a sudden her child care provider guit and abruptly sent her four children out here to live with their mom. She found her family an apartment she could afford but could not swing the \$1700 security deposit. Our funds and our links with community agencies helped her meet the challenge.

Many of our neighbors are trying to cope with limited or no income medical and health problems the pandemic and quarantine sudden life events and transitions scarcity of affordable housing limited availability of rent subsidies.

All these challenges can result in a financial crisis, forcing people into precarious, unstable living environments.

Our stories provide just a few examples of the ways in which Fairlington's *Rent Security Deposit Assistance Program (RSDAP)* collaborates with community service agencies to help families overcome the first barrier to securing and maintaining safe and affordable housing.

The inability to meet the \$1,000 to \$2000 market-rate security deposit requirements means our neighbors can't take advantage of housing vouchers or subsidized rentals. and may quickly result in eviction if delayed payments are not made on time.

Through your gifts to the church and to the FUMC Rent Security Deposit Assistance Program we are able to offer one-time grants of up to \$300 toward a security deposit to help homeless and low-income persons move to housing that they can afford in Alexandria and Arlington.

So far in 2021 RSDAP has offered grants to 79 households for a total of \$22,832 — already well ahead of the pace of requests last year. The requests from our community partners continue to come in at record pace while the struggle to find affordable housing continues to grow.

In order to assist during the coming Fall and Winter, we need the continued strong mission response, generosity and commitment of our church family and we need your help now.
