I love riding roller coasters. My favorite has to be Rockin' Roller Coaster in Disney World. The speed and quick turns are just remarkable. This particular roller coaster is mostly in the dark which adds to the fun and excitement. William and I rode (and re-rode) this one at least five times as quickly as we could wind back and forth through the single rider line.

As much fun as the new super coasters can be, I like the old wooden roller coasters just a much. If I am totally transparent, I don't like the slow surging of the click, click, click as the cars climb that first major incline. I normally try to look around. Never down! Don't look down. I look away from the coaster. I like looking at the park and surrounding area from the bird's eye perspective. Then as the coaster reaches the top, I love the anticipation of chugging to reach the moment the coaster crests the hill and begins the first plummet down the tracks. The scientist in me can't fathom that it's a true free fall. But try telling my stomach that it's not. In our memories, the years pass all too quickly. The wisdom of the poet helps us focus on the most important matter. "Teach us to number our days, that we

may gain a heart of wisdom" (Psalm 90:12). When life seems to be passing us all too quickly or when we look at our life and all we see is the roller-coaster-paced twists and turns, remember that true wisdom is learning to appreciate the presence of God with us through every day. Every moment is our opportunity to serve him and experience his grace. Even the wildest ride through circumstances that throw us for a loop or unexpected twist is an opportunity to see God with us. He will never leave us without a friend to laugh at the sudden jolt or free fall experiences of the roller coaster of life.

There were 52 people in attendance, including local clergy, liturgists and musicians.


Everyone enjoyed the fellowship and the service.
