FROM THE PASTOR ...

Every year, the Lord reminds us of His grace through the rhythm of His creation. Summer eventually gives way to fall. Warm days turn crisp, the trees exchange their green for shades of gold and red, and the harvest comes in. The changing season reminds us that life is always moving, and in every shift, God is at work.

This transition makes me think about our church family. Just as the seasons show change and renewal, we too have been experiencing growth. 

As we enter this season, I encourage each of us to consider: How is God calling me to grow? Maybe it is through prayer, through serving, or through building relationships with those who need to experience Christ's love. Growth happens when we open ourselves to the Spirit's work.

The writer of Ecclesiastes reminds us: "There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under the heavens." This fall is our time to give thanks for what God has done and to prepare for what He will continue to do. May we step into this season with open hearts, grateful for His faithfulness and eager for the growth to come.




