

FROM THE PASTOR . . .

Happy New Year! I hope you have enjoyed a big Southern plate of black-eyed peas, cabbage, and ham. I am still confused what is supposed to bring luck, health, and money. I just love the warm soul food! I wonder what cornbread is supposed to bring? My southern roots won't let me serve black-eyed peas without cornbread.

The New Year season is one of my favorite times of year. I look forward to making New Year's resolutions each year. Some years I do much better at keeping them. It's good for us to find seasons like New Year to reflect on the past, set higher goals, and see what we can accomplish and who we can become in the process.

The Psalmist wrote "Teach us to number our days, that we may gain a heart of wisdom" (Psalm 90:12). This verse does not mention resolutions, but it hints to the spirit behind them. It reminds us that time is not an endless resource. Our days are numbered and known only to God. This awareness is not meant to make us anxious or discouraged, but wise. It is the wise heart, not the strong will, that shapes a meaningful year.

"Teach us to number our days" is a prayer of humility. It admits that without God's perspective, we will misjudge what matters. We will also begin a Young Adult Sunday School class that will meet from 10:00 to 10:30 in the Fellowship Hall area. The class will give us an opportunity to study more deeply Scripture. The class will also build a smaller unit of fellowship and support as we try to live what we learn! I would like to start with a short study of 1 John. The short book gets pretty deep in love and following the example of Christ. It will be a good start for us. As the New Member class gets underway, we will likely combine the two classes for those weeks.

I am excited to see what other great new ministry and missions God will give us opportunity to work. I truly believe that when we are patient and obedient, we will see where God wants us to join His work. Completing the tasks God shows us is a secondary goal. Sure God uses us to accomplish great things through his power. For me, the main reason God invites us to join him is so we can spend time with God to allow him to change US.

As we move into the New Year, may we allow God to change us. Maybe we change through resolutions and personal efforts. Maybe we change because we are spending time with God that shapes us into an example of his love, grace, and nature through Christ.


