The overarching theme for this year's WELS 175th anniversary celebration is "Christ Through Us." We recognize God's many blessings to us over the years of our synod's history. Today's Focus: Christ THROUGH Us

The Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod is celebrating its 175th anniversary in 2025 under the theme "Christ Through Us." From one seminary in 1865, one world mission in 1893, and 800 congregations mostly in the Midwest as of 1965, we can now easily see how Christ has worked through his good news of salvation in Word and sacraments to move this body of believers to establish a Scripture-based ministerial education system, world missions in 45 countries, and more than 1,200 congregations across the United States. The "Christ Through Us" theme will also inform the work of WELS in a ten-year detailed plan to proclaim our Savior's love. Today, the Lord calls us to pray boldly and persistently--to joyfully go before the throne of grace with confidence that God would bless our work. And why can we be so audacious as to go before God in confident prayer? Because it is Christ THROUGH us.


First Reading






