

The Big Idea

We look more like Christ when we put on things in our life that look like Him.

- 1. Our new identity demands new ways of living. (12)
- 2. Christ is our example for living in new relationships. (13)
- 3. Love overcomes our selfish desires and destructive habits. (14)

Our new identity demands new ways of living.

[12] <u>Put on</u> then, as God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, <u>compassionate hearts</u>, <u>kindness</u>, <u>humility</u>, <u>meekness</u>, and <u>patience</u>,

Paul continues his thought of the new life in Christ being patterned after Christ. Just as the new life includes putting off desires and habits that belong to the old self, it also includes putting on the traits that Christ reflected in His life. Remember, from 3:10-11, that Christ is the "pattern" or "image" that we are to follow: [10] and have put on the new self, which is being renewed in knowledge after the image of its creator. [11] ...Christ is all, and in all. The traits of compassion, kindness, etc. are the ones that Christ exhibited as the perfect human. We know that elsewhere that Paul says traits such as these are worked in us by the Spirit. (See the "fruit of the Spirit" in Galatians 5:22-23.)

Our new identity demands new ways of living. con't

[12] Put on then, as <u>God's chosen ones</u>, <u>holy</u> and <u>beloved</u>, compassionate hearts, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience,

The identity of the Colossian believers is found in their relationship with Christ (remember the repeated "in Him" from ch.1 &2). Notice specifically the basis of this new Christlike behavior is the new life that has already been worked into them by faith in Christ. Back in 1:12–14 Paul used similar language of God's initiative leading to them being "holy and beloved":

[12] giving thanks to the Father, who has qualified you to share in the inheritance of the saints in light. [13] He has delivered us from the domain of darkness and transferred us to the kingdom of his beloved Son, [14] in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins.

[13] bearing with one another and, if one has a complaint against another, forgiving each other; as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive.

Just as in the previous verse Paul describes what the new life that is patterned after Christ should look like and he also provides the gospel reasoning that this new life exists. He makes a similar connection in 2:12-13: [12] having been buried with him in baptism, in which you were also raised with him through faith in the powerful working of God, who raised him from the dead. [13] And you, who were dead in your trespasses and the uncircumcision of your flesh, God made alive together with him, having forgiven us all our trespasses, Now, in 3:13, Paul is basing his appeal for Christian relationships on the work of Christ Himself. We forgive because we have been forgiven by Christ.

Christ is our example for living in new relationships.

Paul notes two responses found in Christ's life that are crucial to our relationships with each other. First, we "bear" with one another. Second, we forgive one another. When we bear with one another, we show someone grace for behaviors that bother us but are not intended to hurt us. We bear with behaviors of others that demonstrate immaturity (parents with children, a roommate), insensitivity (husband or wife's communication or friend that only talks about themselves), or disinterest (unhelpful friend, unengaged friend). Moreover, we often have to forgive someone for their actions that did directly harm us and maybe even were intentionally to do so, see the "complaint". How has God forgiven us?

Love overcomes our selfish desires and destructive habits.

[14] And above all these <u>put on love</u>, which binds everything together in perfect harmony.

The supreme work of God in us is to remake us into lovers of others when our old life is characterized by self-love. Paul says that the Christian fellowships and unity ("perfect harmony") require love. If we love others in the church, we will not be easily bothered by them or seek to get revenge against them. If we love others that we have fellowship with (including our own families) then we will be able to display patience and kindness like Christ did. Notice the list in Galatians 5:22–24: [22] But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, [23] gentleness, self-control; against such things there is no law. [24] And those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires.

Living the Christ-centered life:


Have you been made holy and beloved through faith in Christ? Our hope for the future is found "in Him". We are transferred from the domain of darkness into the kingdom of the beloved Son through faith.

What do your responses and action reveal about Christ?

Does your life look like Christ's life? Remember you have a new self that is not like the old self. You have been made alive like Christ and can walk in Him. How would people characterize your responses? As Christlike?

Do your relationships and how you interact with other believers and those close to you display love?

Love is not a "default" mode even for the Christian. We have to be intentional to choose to love in our relationships ("put on love"). 1 Jn reminds us that God is love. We need the work of God in us if we are going to love others wholeheartedly.
